## Elevation-Wise Analysis - July 2023:

- \* High Grown average for the month recorded a **gain of Rs. 18.79 and a decrease of USD 0.09** month on month, whilst **a decrease of Rs. 337.21 and USD 0.64** is recorded YOY.
- \* Medium Grown average for the month recorded an **increase of Rs. 35.26 and a decrease of USD 0.05** month on month, whilst in comparison to the corresponding month last year shows a **decrease of Rs. 260.91** and a decrease of USD 0.43 YOY.
- \* Low Grown average for the month recorded an **increase of Rs. 40.18 and a decrease of USD 0.07** month on month, whilst **a decrease of Rs. 500.54 and USD 1.02** is recorded **YOY**.
- \* All elevations record an increase during the period January-July 2023 in comparison to the corresponding period of 2022 in LKR terms. However, in USD terms High and Medium Growns recorded a gain, whilst the Low Growns recorded a decline (Refer statistical details on Page No. 8).
