COMMENTS

Auction offerings declined and totalled 4.8 M/Kgs, the lowest on offer since Sale No. 16 of 22 and 24 April 2024 (4.7 M/Kgs).

Ex-Estate offerings were maintained around 0.6 M/Kgs. The limited availability of High & Mid Grown liquoring BOP/BOPF's continued to sell well, whilst the Low Growns/Large Leaf teas met with mixed demand.

In the Ex-Estate catalogue, overall quality of teas were reasonably maintained and in the backdrop of limited availability, there was good demand.

In the Best Western category, BOP's - Select invoices, where quality was maintained, were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and easier by a similar margin. Corresponding BOPF's - Select high-priced teas were often irregular and easier, whilst the others where quality was maintained were firm with a few select invoices appreciating following special inquiry. In the Below Best category, select improved BOP's appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the others were irregular following quality. Corresponding BOPF's - Improved teas appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. At the lower end, BOP/BOPF's were mostly firm with select BOPF invoices appreciating by up to Rs. 20 per kg. Nuwara Eliya BOP/BOPF's mostly sold around last. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were irregular. Corresponding BOPF's - Clean leaf types were firm, whilst the others were irregular. Uva BOP's were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Corresponding BOPF's were firm and Rs. 20 per kg dearer for the better sorts, whilst the others were lower by a similar margin and at times unsold.

High & Mid Grown CTC teas - BP1's had hardly any offerings, whilst the PF1's were firm and selectively dearer by Rs. 20 per kg and more. Low Grown varieties sold around last.

Selective buying from shippers to the UK. Fair activity from shippers to Japan, China and South Africa, whilst shippers to the Middle East and CIS continued to participate as usual.

Low Growns totalled approximately 2.1 M/Kgs. All categories met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, BOP1's in general were lower. A selection of high-priced OP1's were firm, whilst the balance were easier. Well-made OP's maintained, whilst the Below Best varieties were easier. Teas at the bottom were firm. High-priced OPA's declined substantially, whilst the balance were firm. Select Best and Best PEK's eased, whilst the Below Best together with the mixed/bolder varieties sold at last levels. Teas at the bottom remained firm. High-priced PEK1's were easier, whilst the balance sold at last levels.

In the Tippy catalogue, a selection of well-made FBOP's were firm on special inquiry, whilst the balance in general were easier. Well-made FF1's together with a selection of clean neat leaf Below Best varieties were firm, whilst the balance were easier.

In the Premium catalogue, a selection of Very Tippy teas were firm following special inquiry, whilst the balance were easier. However, the leafier varieties declined substantially.

The Western and Nuwara Eliya regions reported a slight increase in the crop intake, whilst the Uva, Uda Pussellawa and Low Grown regions maintained.

Best Western's - Select invoices, where quality was maintained, were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and easier by a similar margin. In the Below Best category, select improved teas appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the others were irregular and sold around last week's levels. Teas at the lower end of the market were mostly firm. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold though bids received were around last levels. Uda Pussellawa's were irregular, whilst the Uva's were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids.

BOPF

Best Western's - Select high-priced teas of last week were irregularly easier following quality, whilst the others where quality was maintained were mostly firm with a few select invoices appreciating following special inquiry. In the Below Best category, improved teas appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. At the lower end, select clean leaf coloury teas were Rs. 20 per kg dearer, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliya's were unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uda Pussellawa's - Clean neat leaf types were firm, whilst the others were irregular. Uva's - Clean leaf teas were firm and Rs. 20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids.

OP/OPA

Well-made varieties were easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the Below Best types declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Poorer sorts were firm on last.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

Flavoury PEK/PEK1's were lower by Rs. 40-60 per kg and more at times, whilst the Orthodox Leafy PEK/PEK1's were easier by Rs. 50-70 per kg. A selection of Best Rotovane PEK's sold at last levels following special inquiry, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more. Below Best too followed a similar trend, whilst the poorest on offer sold at last levels.

FBOP/FBOPF1

Flavoury FBOP/FBOPF1's were mostly unsold due to poor demand. Better Orthodox FBOP/FBOPF1's were easier by Rs. 40-60 per kg and more at times, whilst the others and teas at the lower end were firm to easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg.
