QUALITY

High & Mid Growns were barely maintained, whilst the Low Growns were lower to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings continued low and totalled 4.8 M/Kgs. There was fair demand mostly at firm to easier rates.

Ex-Estate offerings too were lower to last and totalled 0.65 M/Kgs. Better overall demand though prices for a majority of the teas on offer, in general, were mostly firm to easier.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's - A few select invoices were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others declined by a similar margin. In the Below Best category, clean leaf coloury BOP's were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others declined by a similar margin. Corresponding BOPF's followed a similar trend with a selection of teas appreciating by Rs. 50-100 per kg following special inquiry, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more. At the lower end, BOP's were irregular, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg lower. Nuwara Eliya BOP's had hardly any offerings, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were dearer following quality. Uda Pussellawa - Better BOP's declined by Rs. 100 per kg. Corresponding BOPF's declined by Rs. 50-100 per kg, whilst the others too were easier to a lesser extent. Uva BOP's declined by up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined by Rs. 50-100 per kg.

High & Medium Grown CTC teas - BP1's sold around last. PF1's - Better sorts were Rs. 50-80 per kg easier, whilst the others were irregular. Corresponding Low Grown types, BP1's continued to sell around last, whilst the PF1's declined by an average Rs. 50-80 per kg.

Less activity from shippers to the UK and Japan, whilst shippers to the CIS continued to bid on a wide cross-section of teas although at lower levels to last.

Low Growns comprised of 1.9 M/Kgs. Leafy, Semi-Leafy and Tippy catalogues met with fair demand.

In the Leafy catalogues, high priced OP1's were firm to marginally easier, whilst the balance declined. Teas at the bottom sold around last levels. A few select Best BOP1's were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the balance declined. A few select Best OP's were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the others sold around last levels. OPA's, in general, were lower. Well-made PEK's were firm to easier, whilst the balance declined. However, PEK1's in general were firm.

In the Tippy catalogues, well-made FBOP's together with the bolder varieties were easier. Cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom were firm, whilst the balance eased. Select Best and Best FF1's were lower. A few cleaner Below Best and a few cleaner teas at the bottom sold around last levels, whilst the balance were easier following quality.

In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas met with good demand and were firm. Best, Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the others sold around last levels.

Sri Lanka's National Tea Sale Averages in September recorded gains in both LKR and USD terms month on month when compared to August 2023 and significant declines year-on-year compared to September 2022.

National tea sales average for the month of September 2023 recorded Rs. 1,165.72 (USD 3.63) showing a **gain of Rs. 55.18** and an increase of USD 0.23 from the August 2023 average of Rs. 1,110.54 (USD 3.39).

In comparison to the September 2022 average of Rs. 1,599.49 (USD 4.46), shows a significant **decrease of Rs. 433.77 and USD 0.83 YOY.**

Elevation-Wise Analysis - September 2023:

High Growns **gained the most with an increase of Rs. 101.51 and an increase of USD 0.37** month on month, whilst **a** decrease of Rs. 402.49 and USD 0.78 is recorded YOY.

Medium Grown average for the month **recorded an increase of Rs. 66.99 and an increase of USD 0.26** month on month, whilst in comparison to the corresponding month last year shows a **decrease of Rs. 315.98 and USD 0.55 YOY**.

Low Grown average for the month recorded an increase of Rs. 37.67 and an increase of USD 0.18 month on month, whilst a decrease of Rs. 456.87 and USD 0.87 is recorded YOY.

High & Medium elevations recorded an increase during the period January-September 2023, whilst the Low Growns recorded a decline of Rs. 30.94 in comparison to the corresponding period of 2022 in LKR terms. However, in USD terms only the High Growns recorded a marginal gain of USD 0.02, whilst the Medium Growns and Low Growns recorded a decline (Refer statistical details on Page No. 8).

In the Below Best category, clean leaf coloury teas were firm and Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others declined by a similar margin and more where leaf appearances showed a decline. Plainer sorts were irregular. Nuwara Eliya's had hardly any offerings. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas declined by up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the others were lower to a lesser extent.

BOPF

Best Western's - Select invoices, where quality was maintained, were firm, whilst the others declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg. In the Below Best category, a small selection of teas gained Rs. 50-100 per kg following special inquiry, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more. Plainer clean leaf types were firm, whilst the others were up to Rs. 50 per kg lower. Nuwara Eliya's - Select Best invoices were firm and dearer, whilst the others were irregular. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas declined by Rs. 50-100 per kg, whilst the others declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg. Uva's - Better teas were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier, whilst the others declined by Rs. 100 per kg and were difficult of sale.

OP/OPA

Well-made OP/OPA's were easier by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others at the lower end were firm to dearer.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available were irregularly easier. Orthodox Leafy PEK/PEK1's, in general, were firm to easier by Rs. 50 per kg. Better Rotovane PEK's sold at last levels, whilst the others were irregular and mostly lower.

FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of flavoury FBOPs that were available were irregularly easier. Well-made Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1's together with the clean leaf Below Best sorts were easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times, whilst the others at the lower end were firm to easier.
