High & Medium Growns wre barely maintained, whilst the Low Growns were marginally lower to last.

COMMENTS

Overall auction offerings were marginally higher this week and totalled 5.49 M/Kgs. Improved demand for the High & Mid Grown Small Leaf teas, whilst the Low Growns continued to witness fair demand with the concerning factor being the significant weakening in prices for the PEK/PEK1 grades.

Ex-Estate offerings maintained and totalled 0.67 M/Kgs. Overall quality of offerings showed no significant change and in this backdrop, it was encouraging to witness improved demand and a distinct classification of the better teas vis-à-vis the poorer counterparts. These teas were closely competed for by shippers to the UK, the continent and Japan with some additional support from the tea bag sector.

In the Western sector, better BOP/BOPF's often appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg, and up to Rs. 100 per kg and more for select invoices following special inquiry. Indeed, an encouraging phenomenon amidst the bearish sentiment experienced over the past few weeks. Also, better demand at the lower end and an average price appreciation of Rs. 20-40 per kg following improved activity from the tea bag sector and shippers to the CIS.

CTC teas continued to sell at last week's levels with no significant change in the overall price structure.


Low Grown offerings maintained and totalled 2.3 M/Kgs. Leafy and Tippy catalogues met with fair demand, whilst the Semi-Leafy catalogue continued to meet with less demand. There was selective activity from shippers to Türkiye.

In the Leafy catalogues, high-priced OP1's appreciated, whilst the balance sold around last levels. BOP1's, in general, were lower. A few select Best OPA's were firm, whilst the balance were easier. Select Best and Best OP's sold around last levels, whilst the balance declined. A few select Best PEK's appreciated on special inquiry, whilst the balance declined. Select Best PEK1's were firm, whilst the balance declined.

In the Tippy catalogues, select Best FBOP's were lower, whilst the Best sold around last levels. Below Best and teas at the bottom were irregular. Well-made FF1's were firm, whilst the clean leaf Below Best and teas at the bottom were firm to dearer. Balance sold around last levels.

In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas met with good demand and were dearer. Best and Below Best too appreciated to a lesser extent, whilst the balance were firm on last.

NATIONAL TEA SALES AVERAGES (OCTOBER 2023)



Key Highlights:

- * Total Elevation Average declines by Rs. 37.58 in comparison to the previous month
- * Cumulative variance widens to a negative Rs. 28.75 (USD 0.25) against end October 2022
- * Individual elevations record negative variances in both LKR & USD Terms against September 2023 & the corresponding month of 2022
- * National tea sales average for the month of October 2023 recorded Rs. 1,128.14 (USD 3.49) showing a decline of Rs. 37.58 and a decrease of USD 0.14 from the month of September 2023 average of Rs. 1,165.72 (USD 3.63).
- * In comparison to the October 2022 average of Rs. 1,483.65 (USD 4.10), shows a decrease of Rs. 355.51 and USD 0.61 YOY.

Elevation-Wise Analysis - October 2023:

- * High Grown average for the month recorded a decline of Rs. 43.54 and a decrease of USD 0.15 month on month, whilst a decrease of Rs. 450.10 and USD 0.91 is recorded YOY.
- * Medium Grown average for the month recorded a negative variance of Rs. 45.95 and a decrease of USD 0.16 month on month, whilst in comparison to the corresponding month last year shows a decrease of Rs. 294.48 and a decrease of USD 0.49 YOY.
- * Low Grown average for the month recorded a **negative Rs. 30.05** and a decrease of USD 0.12 month on month, whilst a **decrease of Rs. 335.76** and USD 0.52 is recorded YOY.
- * High & Medium Grown elevations recorded gains, whilst the Low Growns witnessed a decline during the period January-October 2023 in comparison to the corresponding period of 2022 in LKR terms. In USD terms, all elevations recorded a negative variance.

Low Growns





BOP Best Western's - A selection of teas gained Rs. 50-100 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others sold

around last week's levels. In the Below Best category, brighter teas gained up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliya/Uda Pussellawa's had

hardly any offerings. Uva's too were limited in availability and appreciated by up to Rs. 100 per kg.

BOPF Best Western's - A selection of teas appreciated by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the

others sold around last week's levels. In the Below Best category, select bright invoices appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the others together with the Plainer sorts were firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer. Nuwara Eliya's had hardly any offerings. Uda Pussellawa's - Clean leaf teas were barely steady, whilst the others were easier. Uva's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more for the lighter thinner liquoring teas, whilst select coloury invoices were firm and

irregularly dearer.

OP/OPA Well-made OP's together with the clean leaf Below Best sorts gained by Rs. 50-100 per kg, whilst the others at the

lower end were firm on last. OPA's, in general, were firm to easier by Rs. 50 per kg.

PEKOE/FBOP A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available were irregularly easier. Orthodox Leafy PEK's, in general, were

easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times. PEK1's, in general, commenced firm and declined by Rs. 100-200 per kg and more as the sale progressed. Best Rotovane PEK's sold at last levels, whilst the others were irregular and mostly

dearer.

FBOP/FBOPF1 A limited selection of well-made flavoury FBOPs were firm to dearer, whilst the others were irregularly easier

following quality. Well-made Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1's together with the clean leaf Below Best sorts were firm to

dearer, whilst the others at the lower end were irregular following quality.


