### QUALITY

*Overall, quality levels showed a decline.*

COMMENTS

*Total auction offerings remained reasonably high and totalled 7.0 M/Kgs. Improved demand for Low Grown teas and less demand for the High and Medium Grown liquoring BOP/BOPF's.*

*Ex-Estate offerings, which comprised of 1.1 M/Kgs, showed a general decline in quality to the previous week. Consequently, Best Western BOP/BOPF's declined Rs. 30-40 per kg. In the Below Best category, BOP's which commenced firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg lower declined further as the sale progressed, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined Rs. 20 per kg and more by the close. Plainer BOP's continued to sell around last week's levels, whilst the corresponding BOPF's which were marginally easier at the commencement continued to weaken as the sale progressed with the thinner liquoring teas, in particular, being discounted. Nuwara Eliyas' continued to weaken fairly sharply following plainer quality - BOP's declined up to Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined substantially with many invoices remaining unsold due to a lack of any suitable bid. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP's declined Rs. 20-30 per kg and more following quality, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined Rs. 20-40 per kg and more for the poor leaf fibery sorts.*

*High and Mid Grown CTC teas were irregularly easier by Rs. 10-20 per kg. Corresponding Low Grown varieties sold well in comparison, with more or less a firm trend.*

*Low Grown teas comprised of 2.9 M/Kgs in the Leafy/Semi Leafy and Tippy catalogues. There was improved demand.*

*Well-made BOP1/OP1's in general maintained, whilst the others were irregular and mostly easier. Well-made OP/OPA's in general were fully firm to dearer, whilst the others maintained. Barring a few well-made PEK's - prices for all others, where quality was not maintained, declined substantially and remained unsold without suitable bids. PEK1's, in general, were fully firm to dearer.*

*In the Tippy catalogues, FBOP's in general were dearer. Select Best FF1's appreciated. Best sold around last levels. Cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom appreciated, whilst the balance were firm.*

*In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best together with cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom appreciated, whilst the balance were firm on last.*

<b>BOPF</b>		A majority of the Best Western's declined Rs. 30-40 per kg and more for select high priced teas of last week. Teas in the Below Best category declined Rs. 20 per kg and more as the sale progressed. At the lower end, prices which were firm to marginally easier at the commencement, declined further as the sale progressed particularly for the thinner liquoring teas. Nuwara Eliya's were substantially easier. Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs. 30-40 per kg and more following quality, at times substantially. Uva's were Rs. 20-40 per kg lower with the exception of a few select coloury invoices, which were lower to a lesser extent.

There was good general demand for the 187,218 packages (12,406,954.50 kilos) in the market at irregular levels. 13.60% remained unsold.

LEAF GRADES

Offerings: 98,259 packages (6,411,429.00 kilos) and 12.80% remained unsold.

The best BP1s available met strong support and advanced by up to USC56 closely following quality but a few lines shed up to USC8 while brighter types appreciated by up to USC28 but some invoices eased by up to USC7. Medium categories saw an irregular enquiry ranging between USC4 to USC10 above previous week's levels to easier by a similar margin with lower medium sorts varying between firm to USC6 dearer to easier by USC4 to USC7 and some lines were unsold; plainer types ranged between USC3 to USC18 above last prices for improved invoices to easier by USC3 to USC8 and some teas remained without bids.

Best PF1s in the market met an irregular interest varying between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC5 with brighter categories easing by USC3 to USC4 while medium varieties were discounted by USC4 to USC7 where sold. Lower medium sorts saw an irregular enquiry ranging between steady to USC3 above last rates to easier by USC5 to USC10 with some lines unsold; plainer categories ranged between USC4 to USC8 dearer to easier by USC3 to USC14 and some teas were neglected.

Best PDUSTs in the market were irregular with quality varying between firm to USC2 above last levels to easier by up to USC4 while brighter types held steady to USC14 easier. Medium varieties met improved enquiry at firm to USC14 above previous week's rates with lower medium types irregular varying between steady to USC13 above last prices to easier by USC4 to USC36 and a few lines were unsold; plainer categories ranged between firm to USC28 above last levels to easier by USC2 to USC10 with many invoices remaining without bids. The best DUST1s on offer met an irregular interest with improved lines firm to USC4 dearer but others shed up to USC28 following quality; brighter varieties eased by USC2 to USC4. Medium sorts saw an irregular support ranging between firm to USC2 dearer to easier by USC5 to USC6 while lower mediums varied between USC4 to USC11 dearer to easier by USC8 to USC20 and some invoices remained unsold; plainer descriptions were irregular varying between steady to USC19 above last levels to easier by USC2 to USC13 with some teas neglected.
