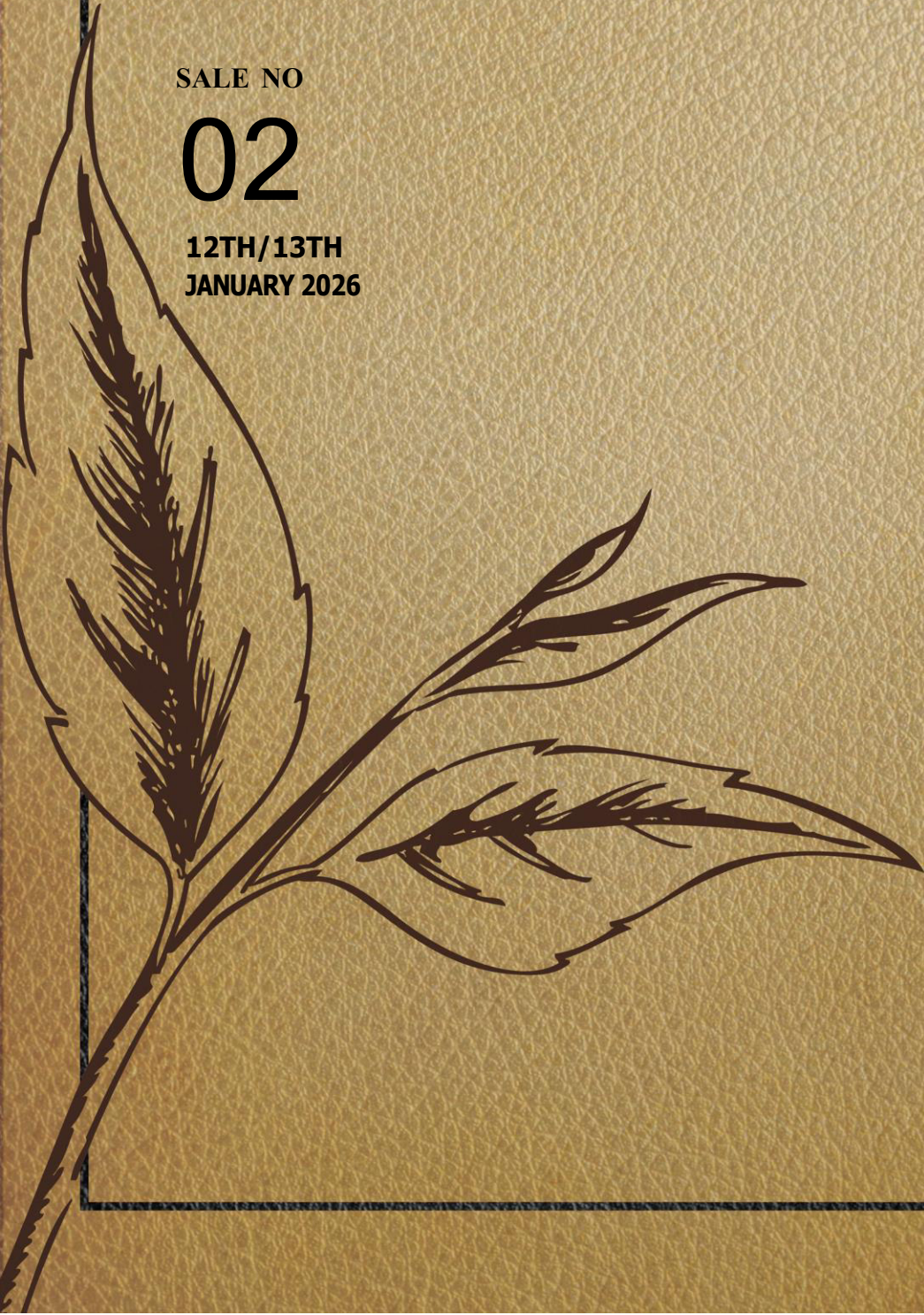

Quality

Westerns together with the Nuwara Eliyas were irregular and barely maintained, whilst the Uva/Uda Pussellawas and Low Grown were similar to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offering totalled 6.0 M/Kgs. There was fair demand mostly at easier rates. Less activity from Iran and the Middle Eastern markets following the recent restrictions in trading conditions.

Ex-Estate offerings were fairly similar and totalled 0.74 M/Kgs. Overall quality of teas on offer showed no significant change.

Teas from the Western Slopes - Best Western BOP/BOPF's - A select range of invoices were firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and often easier by a similar margin. In the Below Best category, BOP's - where quality was maintained - were reasonably firm, whilst the others were irregular. Corresponding BOPF's - Clean leaf types sold around last levels, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. At the lower end, BOP's declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were firm and Rs. 20 per kg easier. Consequently, the price parity between the BOP/BOPF's at the lower end of the market has widened significantly to Rs. 150-200 per kg in favour of the latter. Nuwara Eliya BOP/BOPF's continued to be a weak feature with most invoices remaining unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uva/Uda Pussellawa - BOP's, where quality was maintained, were firm and declined by Rs. 20-30 per kg and more for select invoices following quality. Corresponding BOPF's - Uda Pussellawa's were up to Rs. 20 per kg easier, whilst the Uva's gained by a similar margin for select invoices.

High & Medium Grown CTC teas sold around last week's levels, whilst the Low Grown types were up to Rs. 20 per kg easier.

Selective demand from shippers to the UK, the continent and South Africa, whilst shippers to Japan, China, the Middle East and the CIS were reasonably active mostly at lower levels.

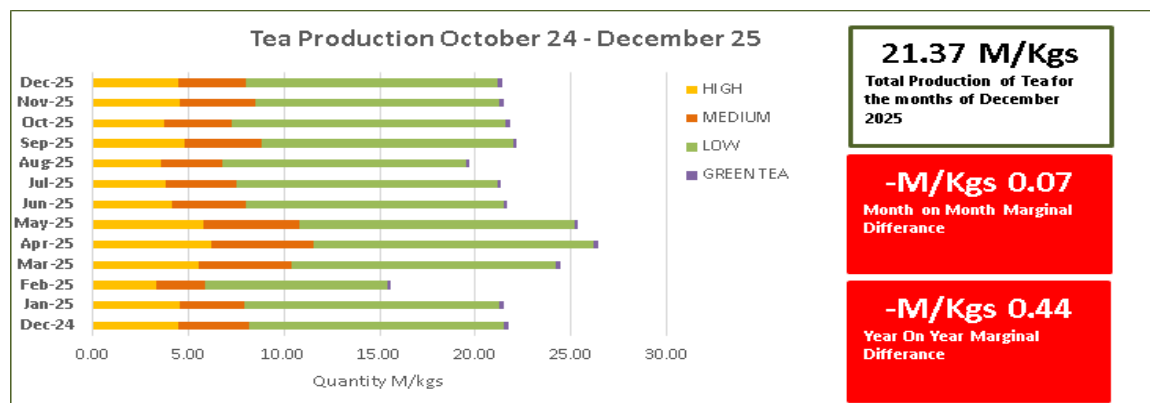
Low Grown totalled approximately 2.4 M/Kgs. The Leafy category met with less demand, whilst the Semi-Leafy category witnessed fair demand although the Tippy category met with fair demand at lower levels.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's together with teas at the bottom were firm, whilst the bolder varieties appreciated. OP1's, in general, were firm. OP/OPA's, in general declined. Select Best and Best PEK's were firm, whilst the Below Best together with the mixed/open varieties declined. Teas at the bottom sold at last levels. High-priced PEK1's maintained, whilst the balance declined.

In the Tippy catalogue, a few well-made FBOP/FF1's sold at last levels, whilst the balance in general declined.

In the Premium catalogue, Tippy teas in general were substantially lower and were mostly unsellable due to a lack of suitable bids.

All elevations except for the High Grown elevation witnessed a decline in comparison with the corresponding month of 2024, whilst the Green Tea production has shown a slight increase vis-à-vis December 2024.

* Compared to 19.81 M/Kgs of December 2023, the corresponding month in the year 2025 shows an increase of 1.56 M/Kgs (Refer table below).

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions



Both regions reported bright weather throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects scattered showers in the Western and Nuwara Eliya regions in the week ahead.

Uva/Udapussellawa Regions



The Uva and Uda Pussellawa regions reported rain throughout the week. Showers are expected in both regions in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Low Grown



Sunny weather and occasional showers were reported in the Low Grown Region throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, misty conditions are expected in the Low Grown Region in the week ahead.

Crop

The Western, Nuwara Eliya, Uva and Uda Pussellawa regions maintained the crop intake, whilst the Low Grown Region reported a slight increase.

BOP

Best Western's - A few select invoices gained by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the others were irregular and often easier by a similar margin. Teas in the Below Best category, particularly where quality was maintained, were reasonably firm, whilst the others were irregular. Plainer sorts declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg. Nuwara Eliya's were barely steady. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's, where quality was maintained, prices were firm and Rs. 20-30 per kg easier, whilst the others declined further.

BOPF

Best Western's - Select invoices were firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and up to Rs. 20 per kg easier. Clean leaf teas in the Below Best and Plainer categories sold around last levels, whilst the poor leaf types declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Nuwara Eliya's were easier and mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were Rs. 20 per kg lower. Uva's were firm and Rs. 20 per kg dearer selectively.

OP/OPA

Well-made varieties were easier by Rs. 30-50 per kg. Below Best types were lower by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst the poorer sorts were firm to dearer by Rs. 20 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

Flavoury PEK/PEK1's were irregularly lower by Rs. 60-80 per kg, whilst the Orthodox Leafy Best PEK/PEK1's were easier by Rs. 50-80 and more at times. Below Best PEK/PEK1's and the others were lower by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Best Rotovane PEK's where quality was improved, were dearer by Rs. 40-50 per kg, whilst the others were mostly firm. Below Best and poorer sorts were irregular by Rs. 20-40 per kg.

FBOP/FBOPF1

Flavoury FBOP/FBOPF1's were selectively dearer following special inquiry, whilst the others were lower by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Better Orthodox FBOP/FBOPF1's were easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times, whilst the others and teas at the lower end were irregularly easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg.

BROKENS

Reducer varieties in the Best category were firm around last week's levels. Clean leaf varieties together with the cleaner Below Best sorts were firm to dearer by Rs. 20 per kg, whilst the poorer sorts declined sharply due to lack of suitable bids.

BOP1A

Main Grade reducer varieties in the Best category declined substantially, whilst the Below Best varieties which commenced easier by Rs. 20-30 per kg, declined as the sale progressed. Poorer sorts were irregularly easier by Rs. 20 per kg and more, on occasion.

Market Report - Orthodox Teas

Market Overview

Orthodox teas opened to a steady but selective tone. CIS and Middle East buyers were active on quality teas while the rest of the catalogue met irregular demand. HUL was selective.

Whole leaf grades attracted moderate export competition, maintaining steady levels with brighter lines occasionally dearer. Liquoring grades held around last sold levels, though improved makes were firm in tone. Medium and plainer teas faced weaker interest and were occasionally easier.

Unsold volumes were slightly higher among medium and plain teas, mainly due to quality variation. Brighter lots cleared well.
