



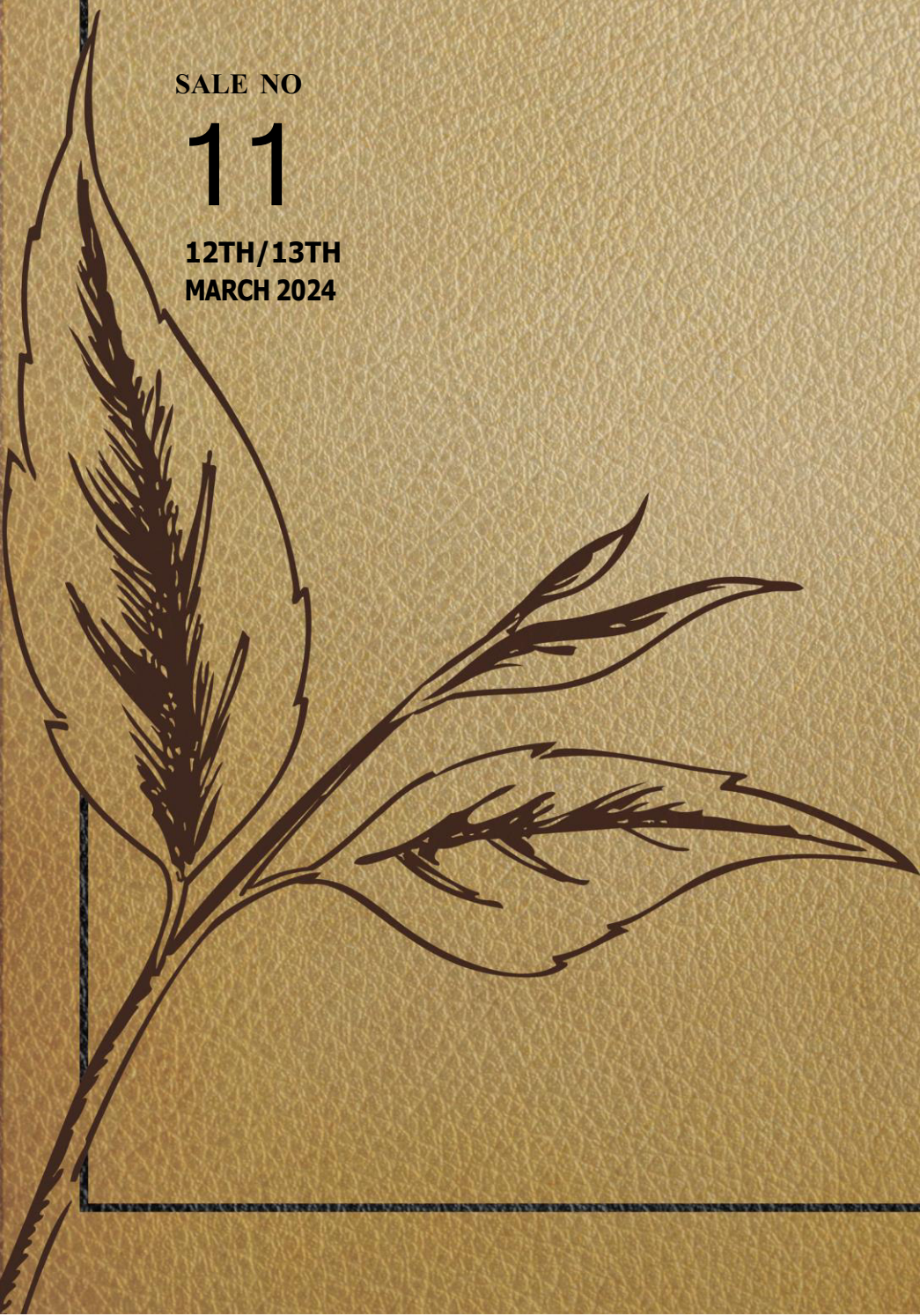

### Quality

Westerns continued to have on offer a fair selection of useful teas. A few select Nuwara Eliyas continued to be of an useful make, whilst the Uva/Uda Pussellawa and the Low Grown were similar to last.

## COMMENTS

Total auction offerings were maintained around last and comprised of 5.3 M/Kgs. There was good general demand.

Ex-Estate offerings showed an increase over last and totalled 0.8 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 0.7 M/Kgs on offer over the last couple of weeks. Quality of teas from the Western slopes comprised of a fairly useful selection of teas, whilst the others showed no significant change.

Better teas continued to sell around last with price appreciations following special inquiry. A selection of improved teas in the Below Best category appreciated significantly in keeping with quality, whilst the limited availability at the lower end appreciated by up to Rs. 50 per kg and Rs. 100 per kg respectively for the BOP and BOPF grades. Teas from the Nuwara Eliya Region were often irregular following quality. Uda Pussellawa BOP/BOPF grades appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and Rs. 100 per kg respectively. Uva BOP's gained up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's gained between Rs. 40-60 per kg.

High & Medium Grown CTC, particularly the PF1 grade, witnessed a correction in prices and on average a Rs. 20-40 per kg drop in values were observed with the exception of the Best available invoices. Corresponding Low Grown varieties too encountered a bearish sentiment with most teas selling around last week's closing levels.

Shipper to the UK, the continent, Japan, China, South Africa and the CIS mostly dominated the sale.

Low Grown teas comprised of 2.20 M/Kgs and met with fair demand at easier rates.

In the Leafy catalogues, high-priced OP1's were easier, whilst the balance sold around last levels. Well-made BOP1's were firm, whilst the Below Best together with the bolder varieties were irregular and mostly lower. However, the teas at the bottom sold around last levels. OPA's, in general, were lower. Few high-priced OP's appreciated, whilst the balance sold around last levels. PEK's, in general, declined. However, the PEK1's were fully firm.

In the Tippy catalogues, FBOP's in general were firm, whilst the bolder varieties declined. Few Select Best FF1's were firm, whilst the others were easier.

In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas met with good demand and were firm to dearer. Best too appreciated, whilst the Below Best and the teas at the bottom were firm.

### BOP

Best Western's were firm and Rs. 50-100 per kg dearer following special inquiry. In the Below Best category, improved sorts appreciated by Rs. 100-150 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. Plainer coloury sorts gained by Rs. 50 per kg and more for select invoices, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliya's were irregular. Uda Pussellawa's were Rs. 50 per kg dearer. Uva's gained by up to Rs. 100 per kg.

### BOPF

Best Western's sold around last week's levels with select invoices appreciating by Rs. 50 per kg and more following special inquiry. In the Below Best category, a selection of improved teas appreciated by Rs. 100 per kg and more, whilst the others were dearer to a lesser extent. Plainer sorts appreciated by Rs. 100 per kg. Nuwara Eliya's continued to sell following quality. Uda Pussellawa's appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more. Uva's gained by Rs. 40-60 per kg.

### OP/OPA

OP's, in general, were irregular following quality. Well-made OPA's were easier by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others at the lower end were firm to dearer by a similar margin.

### PEKOE/PEKOE1

A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available were irregular. Orthodox Leafy PEK/PEK1's, in general, were easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg. A few Best Rotovane PEKs gained by Rs. 50-100 per kg following special inquiry, whilst the balance were irregular but mostly firm. Others and poorer sorts declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more.

### FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of well-made flavoury FBOP's were irregularly dearer. Well-made Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1's were easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg, whilst the teas at the lower end too declined by a similar margin.

### BROKENS

Reducer varieties in the Best category were irregularly lower, whilst the clean leaf Below Best varieties appreciated by Rs. 10-30 per kg following quality. Poorer sorts, in general, were maintained.

### BOP1A

Best varieties, in general, declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more as the sale progressed. Below Best varieties were easier by Rs. 20 per kg, whilst the teas at the bottom end of the market declined by a similar margin and more towards the closure of the sale.

The poorer sorts appreciated by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Low Grown - Best varieties continued to witness lower demand which resulted in most teas being unsold. The Below Best varieties together with the poorer sorts were firm to easier by Rs. 20-30 per kg. Best High & Medium Grown CTC's were easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg. The Below Best varieties together with the poorer sorts were firm to selectively dearer by Rs. 20-30 per kg. Low Grown varieties witnessed irregular demand with certain invoices gaining by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the others remained firm.

### DUST

Clean leaf secondaries appreciated by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst the poorer sorts followed a similar trend. Best Low Grown varieties declined by Rs. 50-80 per kg, whilst the poorer sorts were mostly firm.

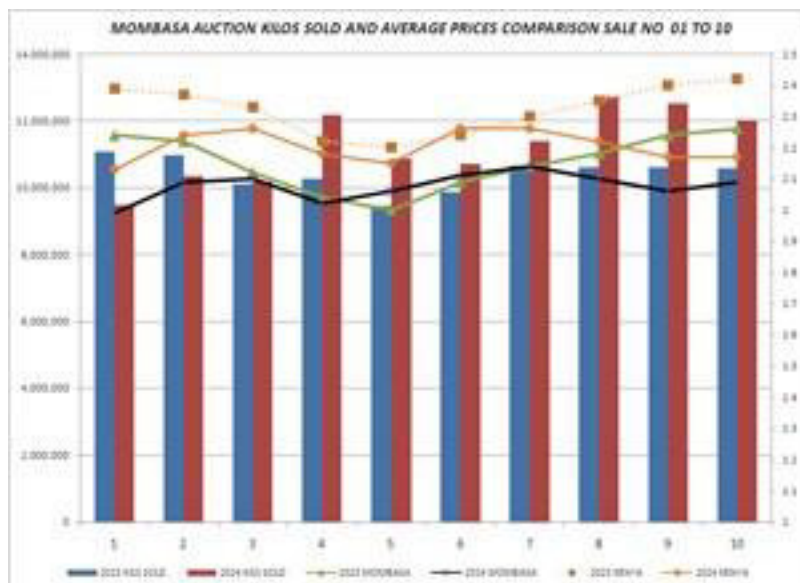
