QUALITY

A few select Westerns were improved. Nuwara Eliyas were irregular, whilst the Uva/Uda Pussellawas showed no change. Low Growns were similar to last.

COMMENTS

A total of 5.1 M/Kgs was on offer. There was improved demand particularly as the sale progressed. Perhaps a correction in the parity rate between the Sri Lanka Rupee/US Dollar would no doubt have helped in the overall strengthening of tea prices this week.

Ex-Estate offerings comprised of 0.74 M/Kgs. Here again, improved demand and particularly a stronger tone at the lower end of the market.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg and Rs. 100 per kg dearer respectively with a few select invoices gaining further following special inquiry. In the Below Best category, better BOP's appreciated up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market gained further. Corresponding BOPF's appreciated Rs. 50 per kg and more for teas at the lower end of the market. Nuwara Eliya - Select Best BOP's were dearer, whilst the others were difficult of sale. Corresponding BOPF's were irregular and easier. Uda Pussellawa - Better BOP's were irregular, whilst the others were often easier. Corresponding BOPF's were firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer. Uva BOP's gained Rs. 50 per kg and marginally more for select invoices, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were firm with select coloury invoices gaining up to Rs. 100 per kg.

High and Medium CTC teas - BP1's were limited on offer and prices were often irregular following quality. Corresponding PF1's - better brighter liquoring sorts were up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others were barely steady. Low Grown types - BP1's were firm and Rs. 20-30 per kg dearer, whilst the PF1's commenced firm and appreciated Rs. 20-40 per kg as the sale progressed.

Low Growns comprised of 2.1 M/Kgs. At the commencement a bearish undertone prevailed and an improvement was witnessed all-round as the sale progressed.

In the Leafy and Semi Leafy catalogues, select Best OP1/BOP1's were easier, whilst the balance were firm towards the close. The teas at the bottom were irregular and mostly lower. OP/OPA's in general were firm, whilst the teas at the bottom were easier, Well-made PEK/PEK1's were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the mixed varieties were easier. Teas at the bottom too were lower following quality.

In the Tippy catalogues, select Best FBOP's were firm to easier, whilst the balance sold around last levels. Teas at the bottom declined. FF1's were substantially lower at the commencement of the sale, however, were firm to selectively dearer as the market improved towards the closure of the sale. Teas at the bottom were irregularly easier.

In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas continued to decline, whilst the Best and Below Best varieties sold around last levels. Teas at the bottom eased.

- * Tea Exports for the month of February 2023 totalled 18.55 M/Kgs, showing a decrease of 2.59 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 21.14 M/Kgs of February 2022.
- * Main categories of Bulk Tea and Packeted Tea have shown a decrease, whilst Tea Bags have recorded a marginal increase when compared to the corresponding month of 2022.
- * FOB value of Rs. 2,040.25 records a significant increase of Rs. 1,077.98 compared to Rs. 962.27 of February 2022.
- st FOB value of USD 5.61 records an increase of 0.82 in comparison to USD 4.79 of February 2022. (Refer table below).

- * January-February 2023 cumulative exports totalled 36.11 M/Kgs, showing a decrease of 4.42 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 40.53 M/Kgs of January-February 2022. Main categories of Bulk Tea and Packeted Tea have shown a decrease, whilst Tea Bags have recorded a marginal increase when compared to the corresponding period of 2022.
- * FOB value of Rs. 2,047.59 records a significant increase of Rs. 1,092.03 compared to Rs. 955.56 of January-February 2022.
- * All main categories FOB values show a positive variance in USD terms, when compared to the corresponding period o 2022 (Refer table below).

Türkiye has emerged as the No. 1 major importer of Ceylon Tea with an increase of 139% YoY in January-February 2023 Iraq has secured the second position followed by Russia having decreased its imports YoY by 37% and 25% respectively UAE has moved down to the 4th position having decreased imports 11% YoY. Azerbaijan has remained as the 5th and show a decrease of 28% YoY in imports during January-February 2023. Other notable importers are China, Saudi Arabia, Libya Jordon and Iran.

lmports from destinations such as Libya and Iran have decreased by a significant 51% and 50% respectively YoY, meanwhile exports to Japan (57%), Lebanon (213%) and Belgium (115%) have shown significant gains (See more details on Page No. 10).

HIGH GROWN TEAS

BOP Best Western's were firm and Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others were mostly firm. In the

Below Best category, better teas were up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market appreciated further. Nuwara Eliya's - Select invoices were dearer, whilst the others were irregular and difficult of sale. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas were irregular, whilst the others were irregular and easier. Uva's gained Rs. 50 per kg

and marginally more for select invoices.

BOPF Best Western's gained up to Rs. 100 per kg and substantially more for a few select invoices. In

the Below Best category, brighter sorts appreciated up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end appreciated up to Rs. 100 per kg. Nuwara Eliya's had hardly any offerings. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer. Uva's were firm and marginally dearer, whilst select coloury invoices gained up to Rs. 100 per kg.

OP/OPA Well-made OP/OPA's firm on last, whilst others together with the teas at the lower end were

easier Rs. 50-100 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 A limited selection of Flavory PEK's that were available were irregularly easier. Well-made

Orthodox leafy PEK's were firm on last, whilst others together with PEK1' in general were easier Rs. 50 - 100 per kg. Best Rotatvane PEK's were irregularly dearer following quality and

special inquiry. Others sold at last levels.

FBOP/FBOPF1 A limited selection of Flavory FBOP's that were available were irregular. Well-made

Orthodox leafy FBOP/FF1's together with cleaner below best sorts were firm to selectively dearer. Others at the lower end were irregular following quality.


