Westerns were barely maintained. Nuwara Eliyas together with the Uda Pussellawas were irregular. Uvas together with the Low Growns were lower to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings declined this week and totalled 6.3 M/Kgs. There was good demand. The better teas continued to command a premium widening the parity between the poorer counterparts.

Ex-Estate offerings declined to 0.85 M/Kgs from 0.95 M/Kg the previous week. Overall quality of teas from the Western planting district showed no significant change, whilst seasonal offerings from the Eastern sector showed a decline in quality and were limited in availability.

Improved demand for the Best Western BOP/BOPF's, which gained Rs. 20-40 per kg and substantially more - a combination of qualitative variances perhaps supported by additional special inquiry. In the Below Best category, a selection of improved BOP/BOPF's gained Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the others were often irregular. At the lower end of the market prices followed a similar trend and appreciated up to Rs. 20 per kg particularly for the clean leaf teas, whilst the poorer varieties were barely steady. A neat/clean dry leaf appearance combined with coloury strong liquor seems to be the sort after criteria as consecutive invoices of the same estate with an inferior dry leaf appearance or thinner liquor were often discounted considerably. Nuwara Eliya BOP's continued to sell fairly well, whilst the corresponding BOPF's sold at substantially lower levels. Uda Pussellawas' were barely maintained and continued to sell at the lower end of the market. Uva seasonal teas - BOP/PEK invoices sold at firm to marginally lower levels, whilst the corresponding BOPF's, once again, were neglected with many invoices remaining unsold.

High and Mid Grown CTC teas continued to witness a firm to dearer trend with select neat leaf invoices appreciating Rs. 20 per kg for the second consecutive week. Indeed encouraging. The corresponding Low Grown varieties, in the backdrop of its limited availability, recorded a substantial increase in price towards the close of the sale and continues to secure a significant premium over the High and Mid Grown counterparts.

Low Growns comprised of 2.6 M/Kgs in the Leafy/Semi Leafy and Tippy catalogues. There was fair demand. Well-made teas together with improved Below Best met with good demand and were fully firm to selectively dearer, whilst the balance were easier following quality.

In the Leafy catalogues, select Best BOP1/OP1's were barely steady, whilst a range of improved Below Best varieties met with fair demand. Better OP/OPA's in general were fully firm, whilst the poorer sorts in particular declined. Select Best together with a range of improved Below Best PEK/PEK1's maintained, whilst the prices declined substantially particularly for the mixed varieties.

In the Tippy catalogues, well-made FBOP/FF1's together with the improved Below Best sold around last levels, whilst the balance were easier following quality.

In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom appreciated, whilst the balance were firm on last.

Total Auction offerings shows a further decline next week and totals 6.2 M/Kgs, of which Ex-Estate offerings comprise of 0.78 M/Kgs.

- * Tea Exports for the month of August 2021 totalled 25.48 M/kgs, showing an increase of 3.47 M/kgs vis-à-vis 22.01 M/kgs of August 2020.
- * Bulk Tea and Packeted Tea categories have shown an increase whilst Tea Bags have shown a marginal decrease when compared to the corresponding period of 2020.
- * FOB value of Rs. 917.20 records an increase of Rs. 52.21 compared to Rs. 864.99 of August 2020. Although, total Rupee FOB value has increased in 2021, in USD terms it reflects a lower value (Refer table below).

Iraq has emerged at the No. 1 position as the major importer of Ceylon Tea, followed by Turkey and Russia with the U.A.E. moving up to the 4^{th} position having increased imports significantly (203% YoY). Iran, which has moved down to 6^{th} position from the 4^{th} position it occupied in 2020, records a fairly significant decrease (18% YoY) in imports during January-August 2021. Other notable importers are China, Libya, Azerbaijan and Syria. Meanwhile, destinations such as Saudi Arabia and Chile have recorded a decrease in imports during the period under review. It is noteworthy that imports to China and Libya have increased significantly YoY - 24% and 39% respectively (See more details on Page No. 9).

BOP

Best Western's gained Rs. 20-40 per kg and substantially more for select invoices following special inquiry. In the Below Best category a selection of improved teas gained Rs. 20-30 per kg and more, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. At the lower end, teas were firm and Rs. 20 per kg dearer on average. Nuwara Eliya's continued to sell well. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg lower. Uva seasonal teas - the limited selection on offer sold around last week's levels, whilst the other non-seasonal types were irregularly firm.

BOPF

Best Western's - Select invoices were Rs. 30-40 per kg dearer following special inquiry whilst the others particularly the thinner liquoring teas were Rs. 10-20 per kg lower. In the Below Best category improved coloury sorts gained Rs. 20-40 per kg whilst the other thinner liquoring teas were barely steady. Plainer clean leaf types were barely steady, whilst the poorer sorts gained Rs. 10-20 per kg. Nuwara Eliya's and Uda Pussellawa's were irregular. Uva's - the limited selection of seasonal teas continued to be neglected, whilst the other non-seasonal coloury clean leaf types Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer. Others were firm.

OP/OPA

Best and Below Best OP/OPA's were firm on last whilst teas at the lower end declined Rs. 10 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

A limited selection of Flavory PEK's that were available were irregular. Well made Orthodox leafy PEK/PEK1's firm on last whilst others were irregular. Better Rotovane PEK's gained considerably. Others and Poorer sorts firm to irregularly dearer.

FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of Flavory FBOP's that were available were irregular. Orthodox leafy FBOP's in general were firm on last. FF1's in general were firm to easier Rs. 10 per kg and more for the teas at the lower end.


