QUALITY

Westerns' together with the Nuwara Eliyas' were irregular and barely maintained. Uda Pussellawa's showed no change and continued to be disappointing for the time of year. Uvas' - a wider selection of seasonal teas were on offer, whilst the Low Growns were improved on last.

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COMMENTS

The total Auction offerings were fairly similar to last and totalled 6.7 M/Kgs. There was improved demand.

Ex-Estate offerings totalled 0.9 M/Kgs. Overall, quality of teas from the Western planting district showed no significant change, whilst a wider selection of improved teas from the Uva Region were on offer.

Best Westerns' - Select invoices of BOP/BOPF's gained Rs. 30 per kg and more, particularly for the BOPF's following special inquiry. Others were irregular. Consequently, significant price variances were observed within consecutive invoices. In the Below Best category, brighter BOP/BOPF's gained Rs. 30-50 per kg and Rs. 20 per kg respectively, whilst the others were irregular and barely steady. Plainer BOP/BOPF's were barely steady with the poorest declining by Rs. 10-20 per kg. Nuwara Eliyas' were firm and dearer following special inquiry, whilst the Uda Pussellawas' were barely steady and continued to sell at the lower end of the market. Uvas' - Seasonal teas encountered wider buyer participation, resulting in these seasonal teas enjoying some attractive prices (as many as 22 invoices sold above the Rs. 1,000 per kg mark). Other non-seasonal type teas from the region declined Rs. 20-30 per kg.

High and Mid Grown CTC teas continued to be a weak feature and often declined by Rs. 10-20 per kg. The corresponding Low Grown varieties continued to sell well around last week's levels.

Low Growns comprised of 2.8 M/Kgs in the Leafy/Semi Leafy and Tippy catalogues.

Well-made teas met with improved demand and were dearer, whilst the cleaner Below Best maintained. Balance were irregular following quality.

In the Leafy catalogues, Select Best BOP1/OP1's together with improved Below Best varieties were fully firm to selectively dearer, whilst the others where quality did not maintain and poorer sorts were barely steady. Better OP/OPA's in general were fully firm to selectively dearer following quality, whilst a range of improved Below Best varieties maintained. Others and poorer sorts were mostly easier. Better PEK/PEK1's were fully firm to dearer, whilst a range of improved Below Best varieties gained. In particular, prices were easier for the mixed varieties and poorer sorts.

In the Tippy catalogues, Select Best FBOP's were firm to easier, whilst the Best and cleaner Below Best appreciated. Balance were irregular following quality. Well-made FF1's appreciated. Cleaner Below Best were firm on last, whilst the balance were irregular following quality.

In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best and cleaner Below Best together with the cleaner teas at the bottom appreciated, whilst the balance were firm.

SRI LANKA TEA EXPORTS - JULY 2021

Sri Lanka tea exports declined by 2.5 M/Kgs - a combination of restricted shipping logistics and perhaps

Covid-19 pandemic related constraints

Tea Exports for the month of July 2021 totalled 25.54 M/kgs, showing a decrease of 2.50 M/kgs vis-à-vis 28.04 M/kgs of July 2020. All main categories of exports (Bulk Tea, Tea Bags and Packeted Tea) have shown a decrease compared to the corresponding period of 2020. Total revenue of Rs. 23.02 B of July 2021 shows a decrease of Rs. 1.31 B compared to Rs. 24.33 B of July 2020. The resulting FOB value of Rs. 901.35 (USD 4.56) records an increase of Rs. 33.69 compared to Rs. 867.66 (USD 4.72) of July 2020. It would be noteworthy that whilst the Rupee FOB values have increased in 2021, in USD terms it reflects a lower value.

January-July 2021 cumulative exports totalled 162.52 M/kgs, showing an increase of 10.39 M/kgs vis-à-vis 152.13 M/kgs of January-July 2020. All main categories of exports (Bulk Tea, Tea Bags and Packeted Tea) have shown an increase compared to the corresponding period of 2020. Meanwhile, revenue of Rs. 150.85 B of January-July 2021 has recorded an increase of Rs. 20.43 B vis-à-vis Rs. 130.42 B of January-July 2020. Total FOB value of Rs. 928.18 (USD 4.76) shows a gain of Rs. 70.91 when compared to the Rs. 857.27 (USD 4.67) of January-July 2020 (See more details on Page No. 9).

Iraq has emerged at the No. 1 position as the major importer of Ceylon Tea, followed by Turkey and Russia with the U.A.E. moving up to the 4th position having increased imports significantly (179% YoY). Iran, which has moved down to 6th position from the 4th position it occupied in 2020, records a fairly significant decrease (25% YoY) in imports during January-July 2021. Other notable importers are China, Azerbaijan, Libya and Syria. Meanwhile, destinations such as Saudi Arabia and Chile have recorded a decrease in imports during the period under review. It is noteworthy that imports to China have increased significantly YoY (33%) (See more details on Page No. 10).

NATIONAL TEA SALE AVERAGES - JULY 2021

National average for the month of July 2021 totalled Rs. 591.35 (USD 2.99) vis-à-vis Rs. 586.51 (USD 2.98) of June 2021, showing a marginal increase of Rs. 04.84 month on month. In comparison to the average of Rs. 611.25 (USD 3.32) for July 2020, shows a decrease of Rs. 19.90 (USD 0.33) YOY.

In analysing the respective elevational averages - High Growns, totalling Rs. 555.26 (USD 2.81) for July 2021, have recorded an increase of Rs. 4.82 month on month vis-à-vis Rs. 550.44 (USD 2.79) of June 2021. In comparing the corresponding period (July 2020) the average of Rs. 533.68 (USD 2.90) records an increase of Rs. 21.58 YOY. Mediums, averaging Rs. 521.70 (USD 2.64) for July 2021, have recorded a decrease of Rs. 9.00 vis-à-vis Rs. 530.70 (USD 2.69) of June 2021. In comparison to the July 2020 average of Rs. 524.57 (USD 2.85), shows a decrease of Rs. 02.87 YOY. Low Growns, totalling Rs. 626.22 (USD 3.17) for July 2021, recorded an increase of Rs. 06.13 vis-à-vis Rs. 620.09 (USD 3.15) of June 2021. Here again, the average shows a fairly significant decrease of Rs. 41.98 YOY when compared to Rs. 668.20 (USD 3.63) of July 2020.

The January-July 2021 cumulative national average of Rs. 623.11 (USD 3.20), records a marginal decrease of Rs. 02.10 (decrease of USD 0.20) vis-à-vis Rs. 625.21 (USD 3.40) of January-July 2020. A detailed report is on Page No. 8.

High Growns for the period January-July 2021 of Rs. 596.48 (USD 3.06) have shown an increase of Rs. 20.56 (decrease of USD 0.08) vis-à-vis Rs. 575.92 (USD 3.14) of January-July 2020. Mediums averaging Rs. 557.66 (USD 2.86) have shown an increase of Rs. 08.82 (decrease of USD 0.13) vis-à-vis Rs. 548.84 (USD 2.99) of January-July 2020. However, Low Growns totalling Rs. 651.57 (USD 3.34) for January-July 2021 have shown a decrease of Rs. 15.48 (decrease of USD 0.29) vis-à-vis Rs. 667.05 (USD 3.63) of January-July 2020. Uva's - Seasonal teas sold well and gained irregularly following quality, whilst the others were Rs. 20-30 per kg lower on last.

BOPF

Best Western's, once again, select invoices were substantially dearer following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular though continued to sell well. In the Below Best category, select coloury invoices gained up to Rs. 20 per kg, whilst the others were irregular. Plainer sorts were irregular and barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's continued to sell well at firm to dearer rates. Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's - Seasonal teas sold at dearer rates following quality/special inquiry, whilst the others were Rs. 20-30 per kg lower on last.

OP/OPA

Well made OP's irregularly dearer whilst others were firm on last. Well made OPA's firm on last whilst others declined Rs. 10-20 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

A limited selection of Flavory PEK's that were available were irregularly easier and mostly unsellable. Well made Orthodox leafy PEK/PEK1's firm on last whilst others were irregularly dearer. Few selected Rotovane PEK's were irregularly dearer following quality and special inquiry. Others declined Rs. 10-20 per kg.

FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of Flavory FBOP's that were available had poor demand and were mostly unsellable. FBOP's in general were dearer Rs. 10-20 per kg. FF1's in general were firm to dearer Rs. 10 per kg.


