# Quality

Westerns were reasonably miantined though irregular. A small selection of improved Nuwara Eliya were on offer, whilst the Uva/Uda Pussellawas and Low Growns were similar to last.

# **COMMENTS**

The 12th sale of the year concluded today had on offer a total of 5.14 M/Kgs. There was fair demand amidst the instability/volatility in the currency.

Ex-Estate offerings comprised of 0.85 M/Kgs. Overall quality of teas from the Western slopes together with the Nuwara Eliyas' were reasonably maintained though irregular, whilst the Uva/Uda Pussellawas' were fairly similar and mostly comprised of fair average quality teas.

Best Westen BOP/BOPF's, where quality was maintained, were firm and selectively dearer, whilst the others were often irregular and easier. In the Below Best category, select improved BOP's gained by Rs. 50 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others continued to sell around last week's levels. At the lower end of the market, coloury BOP's gained by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others continued to sell around last week's levels. Corresponding BOPF's, here again, a selection of improved teas were firm and dearer, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market which were firm and easier appreciated selectively towards the close. Nuwara Eliyas' sold firm and were up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer following quality. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were barely steady, whilst the corresponding BOPF's which commenced firm appreciated up to Rs. 50 per kg as the sale progressed. Uva BOP's were Rs. 50-70 per kg easier, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were barely steady.

High & Medium Grown CTC - BP1's were dearer with Select Best invoices gaining up to Rs. 100 per kg and more. PF1's were mostly firm with select invoices appreciating up to Rs. 50 per kg. Corresponding Low Grown varieties, here again, the BP1's gained by up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the corresponding PF1's which commenced up to Rs. 100 per kg easier, firmed up as the sale progressed and closed around last week's closing levels.

Liquoring teas were strongly competed by shippers to Japan, South Africa and selectively by the UK and the continent, whilst the Tea Bag sector and local trade too were fairly active together with the usual buying by China and the CIS.

Low Growns comprised of 2.04 M/Kgs. Tippy and Leafy categories met with fair demand, whilst the Semi-Leafy category met with less demand. There was selective interest from shippers to Iran, the UAE and the CIS, whilst shippers to Türkiye were less active.

In the Leafy catalogues, high-priced OP1's were easier, whilst the balance sold around last levels. Well-made BOP1's were firm, whilst the balance declined. OP/OPA's, in general, were lower. PEK's were substantially lower. Well-made PEK1's together with the Below Best varieties declined, whilst the clean leaf teas at the bottom were firm.

In the Tippy catalogues, Select Best FBOP's were firm to dearer, whilst the balance sold around last levels. However, the bolder varieties declined. Select Best FF1's were firm, whilst the balance were easier.

In the Premium catalogues, Tippy teas met with improved demand and in general, were dearer.


The Grand Cup Final between Talawakelle Tea Estates PLC and Elpitiya Plantations PLC was played under lights for the first time in the history of the tournament.



# NATIONAL TEA SALES AVERAGES (FEBRUARY 2024)



### Key Highlights:

- \* Total Elevation Average increased by Rs. 45.40 in comparison to previous month
- \* Cumulative variance recorded at negative Rs. 117.49 and positive USD 0.29 against end February 2023
- \* High Grown Elevation witnessed a positive variance both in LKR and USD terms against January 2024 & a negative variance in both LKR & USD terms YoY
- \* Medium & Low Elevations record gains in both LKR & USD terms month on month and YoY
- \* National tea sales average for the month of February 2024 recorded Rs. 1,320.71 (USD 4.25), showing a gain of Rs. 45.40 and an increase of USD 0.26 from the month of January 2024 average of Rs. 1,275.31 (USD 3.99).
- \* In comparison to the February 2023 average of Rs. 1,438.20 (USD 3.96), shows a decrease of Rs. 117.49 and an increase of USD 0.29 YOY.

# Elevation-Wise Analysis - February 2024:

- \* High Grown average for the month recorded an increase of Rs. 78.73 and a gain of USD 0.35 month on month, whilst a decrease of Rs. 233.59 and USD 0.10 is recorded YOY.
- \* Medium Grown average for the month recorded a gain of Rs. 70.45 and USD 0.32 month on month, whilst in comparison to the corresponding month last year shows a decrease of Rs. 100.53 and an increase of USD 0.26 YOY.
- \* Low Grown average for the month recorded a gain of Rs. 17.79 and USD 0.18 month on month, whilst a decrease of Rs. 80.21 and an increase of USD 0.44 is recorded YOY.
- \* All elevations witnessed a decline during the period January-February 2024 in comparison to the corresponding period of 2023 in LKR terms. When compared to the same period, in USD terms, High Growns recorded a decline, whilst the Medium and Low Grown elevations recorded a positive variance.



### Key Highlights:

- \* Monthly Exports totalled 22.31 M/Kgs (Increase of 3.76 M/Kgs against 2023)
- \* F.O.B Value dips to Rs. 1,789.43 for the month (USD 5.76) (Decline of Rs. 306.42 and a gain of USD 0.15 against February 2023)
- \* Cumulative Exports figure passes the 40 M/Kgs mark (41.07 M/Kgs) with a gain of 4.97 M/Kgs YOY
- \* Cumulative F.O.B value of Rs. 1,770.92 (USD 5.62), shows a Rs. 276.67 and USD 0.02 decrease against the corresponding period in the year 2023.
- \* Iraq remains the No. 01 importer of Ceylon Tea to-date for the year 2024 FEBRUARY 2024/2023
- \* Tea Exports for the month of February 2024 totalled 22.31 M/Kgs, showing a positive variance of 3.76 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 18.55 M/Kgs of February 2023. All categories except for Tea Packets and Green Tea have shown improvements in comparison with the corresponding month of the previous year.
- \* F.O.B value in February 2024 was recorded at Rs.1,789.43, a decline of Rs. 250.82 YoY compared to Rs. 2,040.25 of February 2023. All categories have witnessed negative variances in SLR term and positive variances in USD terms expect for the Instant tea segment (Refer table below).

Iraq has been ranked at No. 01 amongst major importers of Ceylon Tea with a total of 5.30 M/Kgs, an increase of 14% YoY in January-February 2024 against the previous year's 4.66 M/Kgs. UAE (4.98 M/Kgs) and Russia (4.52 M/Kgs) emerged at 2nd and 3rd positions respectively, surpassing Türkiye who recorded a decline of 38% against the corresponding period of the previous year. Other notable importers countries are Iran, Saudi Arabia, China, Germany, Azerbaijan and Chile.(Refer statistical details on Page No. 9)

Plainer coloury sorts were up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliya's were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer for select invoices. Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's were Rs. 50-70 per kg easier.

**BOPF** 

Best Western's - Select invoices gained by up to Rs. 100 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular following quality. In the Below Best category, select improved teas were firm and dearer, whilst the others together with the Plainer sorts which commenced firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg easier, strengthened as the sale progressed. Nuwara Eliya's, where quality was maintained, prices were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular following quality. Uda Pussellawa's which commenced firm, appreciated up to Rs. 50 per kg as the sale progressed. Uva's were barely steady.

OP/OPA

OP's, in general, were irregular following quality. Well-made OPA's were easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg, whilst the others at the lower end were firm to dearer by Rs. 50 per kg.

PEKOE/FBOP

A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available were irregularly easier. Orthodox Leafy PEK/PEK1's, in general, were easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times. Few Best Rotovane PEK's sold at last levels following quality and special inquiry, whilst the balance were irregular and mostly lower. Others and poorer sorts too followed a similar trend.

FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of well-made flavoury FBOP's were firm on last. Well-made Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1's were easier by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the teas at the lower end too declined by a imilar margin.


