Overall, no significant change.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings remained static and totalled 5.6 M/Kgs. There was fair demand and a further decline in the unsold volumes.

Ex-Estate offerings were fairly similar to last week and totalled 0.7 M/Kgs. Quality of offerings showed no change, whilst it was encouraging to witness improved activity.

Better Western BOP/BOPF's gained by Rs. 50 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular and often easier. In the Below Best category, select improved BOP's gained by Rs. 50-80 per kg and more, whilst the corresponding BOPF's followed a similar trend. Others together with teas at the lower end of the market sold at firm to marginally dearer rates. Nuwara Eliya - BOP's sold well, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were often unsold. Uda Pussellawa - BOP's were barely steady, whilst the corresponding BOPF's appreciated in keeping with teas at the lower end of the market. Uvas' - High-priced teas were easier, whilst the others generally sold around last week's levels.

High & Medium Grown CTC, BP1's - Better sorts continued to sell well, whilst the others were irregular. PF1's - Continued to sell around last week's levels. Corresponding Low Grown varieties - BP1's were mostly unsold. PF1's were often easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg.


Low Growns comprised of 2.5 M/Kgs. All categories met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's sold around last, whilst the Below Best together with bolder varieties appreciated. Balance were firm. Select Best and Best OP1's were maintained, whilst the balance appreciated. Select Best OPA's were easier, whist the balance together with OP's sold around last levels. Well-made PEK/PEK1's sold around last, whilst the balance appreciated. However, the Below Best together with the mixed PEK1 varieties declined substantially.

Well-made FBOP's were maintained. Clean leaf Below Best together with the bolder varieties appreciated, whilst the balance sold around last levels. FBOP1's, in general, were firm. Well-made FF1's were firm. Cleaner Below Best together with the cleaner teas at the bottom appreciated, whilst the balance were irregular.

In the Premium catalogue, Very Tippy teas were firm. The Best and cleaner Below Best sold around last levels, whilst the balance were irregular. However, the Leafier varieties, in general, were irregularly easier.

- * January-October 2024 cumulative production totalled 217.65 M/Kgs, recording an increase of 1.16 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 216.49 M/Kgs of January-October 2023. Compared to the corresponding period in 2023, High Growns have shown a negative variance, whilst Medium and Low Growns gained in the year 2024.
- * Compared to 211.76 M/Kgs of January-October 2022, cumulative production of 2024 shows an increase of 5.89 M/Kgs. On a cumulative basis, apart from the High Growns, all elevations have shown positive variances over the corresponding period of 2022 (Refer table below).

- * Cumulative F.O.B Value reaches Rs. 1,774.98 (USD 5.87), recording a Rs. 2.45 decrease (increase of USD 0.43) against the corresponding year-to-date period of 2023.
- * Iraq retains the top position amongst leading importer countries of Ceylon Tea for the cumulative period in 2024

* Tea Exports for the month of October 2024 totalled 20.79 M/Kgs, showing a positive variance of 2.58 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 18.21 M/Kgs of October 2023. All categories have recorded gains in comparison with the corresponding month of the previous year. FOB value in October 2024 was recorded at Rs. 1,791.78, an increase of Rs. 86.54 YoY, compared to Rs. 1,705.23 of October 2023 (Refer table below).

January-October 2024/2023

- * January-October 2024 cumulative exports totalled 203.15 M/Kgs, recording an increase of 3.45M/Kgs vis-à-vis 199.70 M/Kgs of January-October 2023. Tea Packets recorded a negative variance, whilst all other categories have shown positive variances against the same period of the previous year.
- * FOB value for the period stood at Rs. 1,774.98, a marginal decrease of Rs. 2.45 (increase of USD 0.43) vis-à-vis Rs. 1,777.43 of January-October 2023.
- * Tea in Bulk and Packeted tea recorded marginal gains in LKR terms on FOB value, whilst the other categories recorded negative variances compared to the corresponding period in 2023.
- * In USD terms, all categories recorded gains except for the Instant Tea category which recorded a marginal decline in FOB value compared to the corresponding period in 2023 (Refer table below).

Iraq ranks at No. 1 amongst major importers of Ceylon Tea with a total of 27.11 M/Kgs in January-October 2024, a marginal decline of 3% YoY against the previous year's 28.09 M/Kgs, whilst Russia at 2nd place has witnessed an increase of 8% YoY with 20.61 M/Kgs. The U.A.E with 18.75 M/Kgs (27% increase YoY) followed by Türkiye 14.76 M/Kgs (42% decrease YoY), China 9.67 M/Kgs (2% decrease YoY), Azerbaijan 8.76 (increase of 15%) and Iran 8.75 M/Kgs (increase of 83%) have been cited as other notable importers of Ceylon Tea during the period of January-October 2024. Best Western's - A few select invoices gained by Rs. 50 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular following quality. In the Below Best category, a few select invoices were substantially dearer following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular following quality. Teas at the lower end sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliya's - Better teas were firm, whilst the others were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and Rs. 20 per kg dearer. Uva's - A few select invoices were Rs. 20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were lower by a similar margin.

OP/OPA

OP/OPA's, in general, were firm to marginally lower.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available were irregularly lower. Orthodox Leafy well-made PEK/PEK1's were firm on last, whilst the others were easier. Best Rotovane PEK's, where quality was maintained, appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others and poorer sort were irregular and mostly firm.

FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of flavoury FBOP's that were available were irregularly lower following quality. Well-made Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1's were firm on last, whilst the teas at the lower end were firm to dearer.
