COMMENTS

Total Auction offerings remained around last and totalled 5.4 M/Kgs, of which Ex-Estate offerings comprised of 0.75 M/Kgs. There was fair demand.

In the Ex-Estate catalogue, Best Western BOP's - A few select invoices were firm and up to Rs. 20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular mostly following quality. Corresponding BOPF's too had a few select invoices which were firm and dearer, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. In the Below Best category, a few select BOP invoices appreciated by Rs. 20 per kg, whilst the others were irregular and lower by a similar margin. Corresponding BOPF's - Teas in the higher price bracket were barely steady, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20 per kg and more. At the lower end, BOP's mostly declined by up to Rs. 20 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were generally firm. Nuwara Eliyas' continued sluggish with many unsold teas. Uda Pussellawa BOP's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were firm and Rs. 20 per kg dearer. Uva BOP's declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's sold around last.

High & Mid Grown CTC teas - BP1's had hardly any offerings. PF1's - Better sorts sold around last, whilst the others were irregular and Rs. 20-40 per kg easier. Corresponding Low Grown types continued to sell well.

Less activity from shippers to the UK and the continent. Improved though selective interest from shippers to South Africa, whilst shippers to Japan and China continued to maintain market activity. Shippers to the CIS and Middle East bid on a wider cross-section of the teas.


Low Growns totalled approximately 2.3 M/Kgs with fair demand witnessed in the Leafy, Semi-Leafy, Tippy and Premium categories.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's were firm, whilst the cleaner Below Best appreciated. Balance sold around last levels. Select Best and Best OP1's together with the cleaner Below Best were firm to dearer, whilst the balance were irregular. Well-made OP's together with the cleaner Below Best sold around last levels, whilst the balance were irregular. A few select Best OPA's appreciated on special inquiry, whilst the balance maintained. Select Best and Best PEK's declined, whilst the Below Best together with teas at the lower end sold around last levels. High-priced PEK1's were firm to marginally easier, whilst the Best appreciated. Balance, in general, were easier.

In the Tippy catalogue, Select Best and Best FBOP's were firm. However, the cleaner Below Best were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the balance sold around last levels. Well-made FF1's together with the cleaner Below Best maintained at last levels, whilst the balance together with teas at the lower end were irregular following quality.

In the Premium catalogue, Very Tippy teas met with good demand and were dearer, whilst the Best too followed a similar trend. Balance were firm on last levels. However, the leafier types were irregular.

- * Sri Lanka Tea Production for the month of September 2025 totalled 22.18 M/Kgs, witnessing a decline of 2.21 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 24.39 M/Kgs of September 2024. High Growns witnessed an increase, whilst the Mid Growns and Low Growns witnessed a decline in comparison with the corresponding month of 2024.
- * Compared to 18.90 M/Kgs of September 2023, the corresponding month in the year 2025 shows an increase of 3.28 M/Kgs (Refer table below).

- * January-September 2025 cumulative production totalled 199.09 M/Kgs, recording an increase of 2.22 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 196.87 M/Kgs of January-September 2024. All elevations except for the Low Grown elevation recorded increases in comparison with the corresponding period of 2024.
- * Compared to 193.49 M/Kgs of January-September 2023, cumulative production of 2025 shows an increase of 5.60 M/Kgs. On a cumulative basis, all elevations except for the High Grown elevation shown positive variances when compared with the same period in the year 2023 (Refer table below).

Key Highlights:

- * Ceylon Tea Exports for the month was recorded at 23.78 M/Kgs (Increase of 3.98 M/Kgs YoY)
- * Cumulative Exports totalled 198.33 M/Kgs (Increase of 15.97 M/Kgs YoY) in comparison with January-September 2024 total of 182.36 M/Kgs
- * F.O.B Value for the month was recorded at Rs. 1,741.45 (USD 5.76), recording a decline of Rs. 39.02 (USD 0.15) against the corresponding period of 2024
- * Cumulative FOB Value declined by Rs. 18.60 in comparison with the corresponding period of 2024, whilst the to-date USD earnings continued to show an overall improvement in all categories except for Packeted Tea
- * Iraq continues to maintain top position amongst leading importer countries of Ceylon Tea for the year

September 2025/2024

- * Tea Exports for the month of September 2025 totalled 23.78M/Kgs, showing an increase of 3.98 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 19.80 M/Kgs of September 2024. All categories record positive variances in comparison with the corresponding period of previous year.
- * FOB value in September 2025 was recorded at Rs. 1,741.45, a decrease of Rs. 39.02 YoY compared to Rs. 1,780.47 of September 2024 and a decline of USD 0.15 in USD terms too was recorded in comparison with the corresponding period in the year 2024 (Refer table below).

- * January-September 2025 cumulative exports totalled 198.33 M/Kgs, recording a positive variance of 15.97 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 182.36 M/Kgs of January-September 2024. All segments, except for Bulk Tea have recorded positive variances against the same period of the previous year.
- * FOB value for the period stood at Rs. 1,754.46, a decrease of Rs. 18.60 (increase of USD 0.06) vis-à-vis Rs. 1,773.06 of January-September 2024.
- * Bulk and Packeted Tea recorded negative variances, whilst Tea Bags, Instant and Green Tea categories recorded gains in LKR terms in FOB value and gains were recorded in USD terms in all categories except for Tea Packets when compared to the corresponding period in 2024 (Refer table below).

Iraq ranks at No. 1 amongst major importers of Ceylon Tea with a total of 30.07 M/Kgs, an increase of 24% YoY in January-September 2025 against previous year's 21.16 M/Kgs. Russia ranked in 2nd Place with 16.69 M/Kgs, despite a decline of 10% in comparison with previous year, whilst Libya at 3rd Place recorded 15.94 M/Kgs, an improvement of 154% ahead of Türkiye at 4th place who have witnessed a 14% increase YoY with 15.26 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 13.40 M/Kgs recorded in 2024. U.A.E with 14.27 M/Kgs (18% decline YoY) followed by Iran have recorded 9.0 M/Kgs (11% Increase YoY) surpassing Chile at 8.50 M/Kgs. China has secured 8th place with 7.92 M/Kgs followed by Azerbaijan and Saudi Arabia at 6.73 and 6.49M/Kgs respectively.

BOPF Best Western's - A few select invoices were firm to marginally dearer, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg.

In the Below Best category, teas in the higher price bracket were barely steady, whilst the others often declined by Rs. 20 per kg and more for select invoices. Teas at the lower end of the market were generally firm. Nuwara Eliya's were

mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and Rs. 20 per kg dearer. Uva's sold around last week's levels.

OP/OPA Well-made varieties were easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the Below Best types declined by Rs. 30-50 per kg. Poorer

sorts were difficult of sale and eased by Rs. 60-80 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

Flavoury PEK/PEK1's were difficult of sale, whilst the Orthodox Leafy Best PEK's were easier by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Below

Best and others were irregularly lower by Rs. 30-50 per kg. Best PEK1's were firm to dearer by Rs. 30-50 per kg, whilst the Below Best varieties appreciated by Rs. 50-70 per kg and more at times. A few Select Best Rotovane PEK's sold at last following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregularly lower. Below Best varieties declined by Rs. 40 per kg

and more at times, whilst the poorer sorts were barely steady.

FBOP/FBOPF1 Flavoury FBOP/FBOPF1's declined by Rs. 30-60 per kg. Better Orthodox FBOP/FBOPF1's were firm to easier by Rs. 20-

40 per kg, whilst the others and teas at the lower end appreciated by Rs. 40-60 per kg and more at times.


