High & Mid Growns were lower to last, whilst the Low Growns were similar to last.

COMMENTS

This week's total offerings of 5.7 M/Kgs met with less demand and often a declining trend in prices. Lower quality combined with less activity from shippers to Iran and a cautious approach by buyers on account of the volatility in the currency resulted in a bearish market sentiment.

Ex-Estate offerings totalled 0.9 M/Kgs, up from the 0.80 M/Kgs on offer the previous week. Overall quality of teas showed a decline and consequently, a greater availability at the lower end of the market.

The limited availability of Best Western BOP/BOPF's witnessed a firm and Rs. 50 per kg easier trend in prices. In the Below Best category, BOP/BOPF's encountered a similar weakening in prices by Rs. 50 per kg and more for tea in the higher price bracket. Others together with teas at the lower end of the market - BOP's were barely steady, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined by Rs. 20 per kg and more as the sale progressed. As highlighted in the previous week's report as well, the price parity between the Below Best and Plainer categories have narrowed quite considerably perhaps largely following the decline in quality. Nuwara Eliya BOP's sold relatively well, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were often unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uva/Uda Pussellawas' - Better BOP's gained by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others were barely steady. Corresponding BOPF's too followed a similar trend, with the clean leaf teas selling around last week's levels and the fibery types declining by Rs. 20 per kg and more.

High & Medium Grown CTC teas too followed a lower trend for the PF1 grade which eased by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more, and here again often following quality. Low Grown types were generally firm.

Low Growns comprised of 2.4 M/Kgs. All categories met with fair demand although teas in the Semi-Leafy and Tippy catalogues witnessed a declining trend in prices.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's were firm, whilst the balance declined substantially. High-priced OP1's were firm, whilst the Best and Below Best varieties were easier. Teas at the bottom maintained. Well-made OP/OPA's were firm, whilst the balance were easier. High-priced PEK's were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the Best and Below Best varieties declined sharply. Teas at the bottom were firm to easier. PEK1's, in general, were lower.

Select Best FBOP's were firm to easier, whilst the balance in general declined. However, the bolder varieties declined substantially. FBOP1's too, in general, were easier.

In the Premium catalogue, high-priced Tippy teas were firm to easier, whilst the Best together with cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom were firm. The balance were easier following quality. A few select Best FF1's sold around last levels, whilst the balance in general were easier.

NATIONAL TEA EXPORTS



Key Highlights:

- * F.O.B Value records Rs. 1,780.47 for the month (USD 5.95) (Increase of Rs. 109.08 and USD 0.75 against 2023)
- * Cumulative Exports recorded 182.36 M/Kgs (Increase of 0.87 M/Kgs YoY)
- * Cumulative F.O.B Value reaches Rs. 1,773.06 (USD 5.84), recording a decrease of Rs. 11.61 and an increase of USD 0.39 against the corresponding year-to-date period of 2023
- * Export Earnings for the month stands at Rs. 35.24 Bn (USD 117.67 Mn) (Decrease of Rs. 3.48 Bn and 8.96%)
- * Total Earnings for the year witness a Rs. 0.56 Bn decline (Rs. 323.33 Bn in 2024 vis-à-vis Rs. 323.89 Bn in 2023). Interestingly, USD earnings for the cumulative period of January-September 2024 surpassing USD 1 Bn records a marginal gain vis-à-vis 989 Mn during the corresponding period in 2023
- * Iraq retains the top position amongst leading importer countries of Ceylon Tea for the cumulative period in 2024

SEPTEMBER 2024/2023

- * Tea Exports for the month of September 2024 totalled 19.79 M/Kgs, showing a negative variance of 3.37 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 23.16 M/Kgs of September 2023. Tea in Bulk and Packeted Tea show negative variances, whilst Tea Bags, Instant Tea and Green Tea have recorded marginal gains in comparison with the corresponding month of the previous year.
- * FOB value in September 2024 was recorded at Rs. 1,780.47, an increase of Rs. 109.08 YoY compared to Rs. 1,671.39 of September 2023 (Refer table below).
- * Export Earnings for the month was recorded at Rs. 35.24 Bn, a decline of Rs. 3.48 Bn (-8.96%) vis-à-vis Rs. 38.72 Bn earned in the corresponding month of the previous year.

JANUARY-SEPTEMBER 2024/2023

- * January-September 2024 cumulative exports totalled 182.36 M/Kgs, recording an increase of 0.87 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 181.49 M/Kgs of January-September 2023. Tea Packets have recorded a negative variance, whilst all other categories have shown positive variances against the same period of the previous year.
- * FOB value for the period stood at Rs. 1,773.06, a decrease of Rs. 11.61 (increase of USD 0.39) vis-à-vis Rs. 1,784.66 of January-September 2023.
- * Earnings on a cumulative basis stood at Rs. 323.33 Bn, a decline of Rs. 0.56 Bn against the Rs. 323.89 Bn recorded in January-September 2023.
- * All categories showed negative variances in LKR terms in FOB value, whilst gains were recorded in USD terms when compared to the corresponding period in 2023 (Refer table below).

Iraq ranks at No. 01 amongst major importers of Ceylon Tea with a total of 24.16 M/Kgs, a marginal decline of 6% YoY in January-September 2024 against the previous year's 25.83 M/Kgs, whilst Russia at 2nd place has witnessed an increase of 4% YoY with 18.45 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 17.74 M/Kgs recorded in 2023. The U.A.E with 17.49 M/Kgs (33% increase YoY) followed by Türkiye 13.40 M/Kgs (43% decrease YoY), China 8.84 M/Kgs (96% increase YoY) and Iran 8.15 M/Kgs have been cited as other notable importers of Ceylon Tea in the period of January-September 2024. Plainer sorts were irregular and barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's - Limited invoices on offer sold well around last week's levels. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas were firm and up to Rs. 50

per kg dearer, whilst the others were barely steady.

BOPF Best Western's - A few select invoices were firm, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more following

quality. In the Below Best category, teas in the higher price bracket declined by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market declined by Rs. 20 per kg and more as the sale progressed. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's - Clean leaf types were firm, whilst the

others declined by Rs. 20 per kg on average.

OP/OPA OP/OPA's, in general, declined by Rs. 50-100 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available declined sharply and were mostly unsold. Orthodox Leafy

PEK/PEK1's, in general, were firm to easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg. Select Best Rotorvane PEK's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more following quality/ special inquiry, whilst the balance sold at last levels. Others and poorer sorts were

irregular and mostly lower.

FBOP/FBOPF1 A limited selection of flavoury FBOP's that were available declined sharply and were mostly unsold. Well-made

Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1's were easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times, whilst the teas at the lower end were

irregularly easier following quality.



DEMAND:

MARKET:

The total CTC leaf teas sold this week was 58.21% (1,349,015.64kgs) of the total offering of 2,317,649.43kgs. The best category larger broken sold easier by Rs. 5 to 10 or more. Remaining sorts in this category sold at substantially easier prices with select few lines at the top end appreciating following quality. Good category teas sold sold easier by Rs. 4 to 5 or more however, a larger percentage of teas continued to remain unsold due to want of bids. All sorts in the remaining categories of teas saw a fall in prices by Rs. 6 to 8 with larger percentage of teas remaining unsold.

BUYING PATTERN:

Regional Packateers, Western India and the major buyers continued to be the mainstay of the market whilst the others were very selective Exporters were quiet. The major blenders absorption stood at 67.53% of the total CTC leaf sold.

ORTHODOX LEAF

DEMAND:

Continued weak demand.

MARKET:

The high grown whole leaf and broken sold were irregularly easier except for select few invoices in the whole leaf which appreciated following competition. The fanning too declined sharply in prices. Remainders too saw an easier trend with stalky and less denser teas facing withdrawals.

BUYING PATTERN:

Exporters were fairly active but were price sensitive. Up country buyers were very choosy along with the internal buyers.

MARKET

CTC dust offer this week was at 560,130.27Kgs of which 254,764.27kgs were sold (45.48%). A similar trend of last week continued with all sorts declining by Rs, 8 or more with a substantial volume of teas remaining unsold.

Major blenders were very choosy. The up-country buyers were very selective along with regional and local packeteers. Exporters continued to operate selectively, particularly on the blacker dust.
