Quality

Westerns were lower to last. Nuwara Eliyas were barely maintained. Uva/Uda Pussellawas showed no significant change, whilst the Low Growns were similar to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings declined to 4.6 M/Kgs this week. There was fair demand.

Ex-Estate offerings too declined and totalled 0.60 M/Kgs from 0.70 M/kgs the previous week. Overall quality of teas were not as useful and perhaps in the backdrop of the limited availability, prices were reasonably maintained.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's, where quality was maintained, were mostly firm, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more following quality. In the Below Best category, a few select coloury BOP's appreciated following special inquiry, whilst the others were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Corresponding BOPF's sold around last. At the lower end, BOP's were barely steady, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were Rs. 20-30 per easier except for select clean leaf coloury sorts which sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliyas' continued to sell well. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were barely maintained, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were Rs. 20-30 per kg easier. Uvas' were barely maintained.

High & Medium Grown CTC's - BP1's had hardly any offerings. PF1's - Better teas were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg easier, whilst the poorer sorts particularly in the Mid Grown category were often neglected. Corresponding Low Grown varieties - BP1's were generally firm, whilst the PF1's too were generally firm except for the poorer sorts which declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg on average.

Low Growns comprised of 1.73 M/Kgs and all categories met with fair demand. Shippers to the CIS, Türkiye and Iran were active, in general.

In the Leafy/Semi-Leafy catalogues, BOP1's in general were firm, whilst the OP1's were lower. Well-made OP's were firm, whilst the balance were easier. OPA's, in general, were lower. PEK's were firm to dearer. Select Best PEK1's were easier, whilst the balance were firm to selectively dearer.

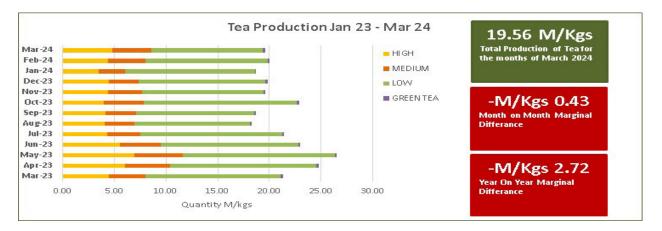
In the Tippy catalogues, FBOP's in general were firm, whilst the bolder varieties were firm to selectively dearer. Well-made FF1's together with the clean leaf Below Best were firm, whilst the balance were easier following quality.

In the Premium catalogues, Very Tippy teas met with good demand and were substantially dearer. Best and Below Best varieties too were dearer to a lesser extent, whilst the balance sold around last levels.

The Nuwara Eliya, Uva, Udapussellawa and Low Grown regions reported an increase in the crop intake, whilst the Western Region showed a decline.

and more following quality. In the Below Best category, a few select coloury teas appreciated following special inquiry, whilst the others were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Teas at the lower end of the market were barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's continued to sell well though prices tend to fluctuate following quality. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's

were barely steady.

BOPF Best Western's, where quality was maintained, were mostly firm, whilst the others were irregular and easier by up to

Rs. 50 per kg. Teas in the Below Best category continued to sell around last. Plainer clean leaf types were firm, whilst the others were irregular and Rs. 20-30 per kg easier. Nuwar Eliya's were firm and Rs. 20-30 per kg dearer. Uda

Pussellawa's were Rs. 20-30 per kg easier. Uva's were generally firm.

OP/OPA OP's, in general, were irregular following quality. Well-made OPA's were dearer by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst teas at the

lower end were firm to dearer.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available were irregularly dearer. Orthodox Leafy PEK's, in general,

were easier. PEK1's appreciate by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more as the sale progressed. Best Rotovane PEK's were

irregular and mostly lower, whilst the others and poor sorts decline by Rs. 40-60 per kg.

FBOP/FBOPF1 A limited selection of well-made flavoury FBOP's were firm to easier. Well-made Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1's were

easier by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times, whilst teas at the lower end declined by a similar margin.

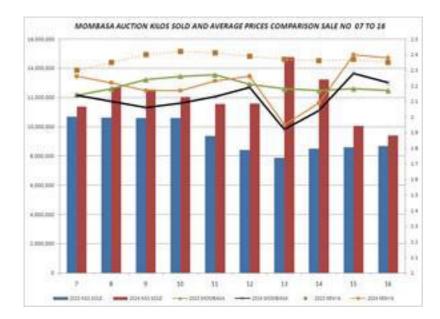

CTC LEAF

DEMAND: Reduced demand and further depleted as the sale progressed.

MARKET: The total CTC leaf teas sold this week was 74.40% (929,452.20kgs) of the total offering of 1,249,271.76Kgs.

LARGER BROKEN: Best & good liquoring larger broken met with subdued demand and only a few lots sold at substantially lower prices. Remaining category larger broken though sold in larger percentage prices eased between Rs. 1 to Rs. 3.

MEDIUM BROKEN: Only a limited volume of best and good categories only sold at easier prices, Larger percentage of teas in this category continue to remain unsold. Better medium, medium & plainer teas sold barely steady however as the sale progressed demand started depleting and larger volumes of teas went unsold.

SMALLER BROKEN: Select invoices in the top end sold barely steady, however larger volume sold substantially easier particularly at the lower end of the best category. Good teas eased by Rs. 3 to 5. Better medium, smaller broken saw an easier market by Rs. 2 to 8 with larger volume of teas remained unsold especially as the sale progressed, whilst the medium and plainer teas sold barely steady with the browner and fibrous sorts discounted.

FANNING: Less demand on the best teas with the market substantially easier. Good teas saw a huge fall in demand with a larger percentage of good teas remaining unsold and better medium teas witnessing a price drop of up to Rs. 5. Medium & plainer teas fetched barely steady prices.
