COMMENTS

Auction offerings were fairly similar to last and totalled 7.1 M/Kgs. There was fair demand at easier rates. Higher volumes combined with lower quality and the instability in the currency would be the contributing factors for the declining market.

Ex-Estate offerings totalled 1.0 M/Kgs. Overall quality from the Western and Nuwara Eliya Planting Districts were mostly lower to last, whilst teas from the Uva/Uda Pussellawa regions were irregular and here again, were often lower to last.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's - Improved activity for select invoices which were firm and often appreciated on last week's levels, whilst the others declined by an average of Rs. 50 per kg. In the Below Best category, BOP's declined up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's on average eased by Rs. 50-70 per kg. Plainer BOP's eased by Rs. 100 per kg and more, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined Rs. 50-70 per kg and often more towards the close. Nuwara Eliyas' were easier and often difficult of sale. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were up to Rs. 100 per kg easier. Corresponding BOPF's - Better sorts declined up to Rs. 200 per kg, whilst the others were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Uva - Few select BOP's were barely steady, whilst a majority declined Rs. 50-70 per kg. Corresponding BOPF's - Select invoices declined Rs. 20-30 per kg, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more particularly by the close.

High & Medium Grown CTC teas - BP1's were irregular and often easier, whilst the PF1's declined Rs. 20-40 per kg and more by the close. Low Grown varieties sold around last.

Low Growns comprised of 2.9 M/Kgs. Leafy, Semi Leafy and Tippy catalogues met with lower demand.

In the Leafy and Semi Leafy catalogues, OP1's in general were easier. A selection of BOP1's were firm to selectively dearer on special inquiry, whilst the balance declined. Well-made OP/OPA's together with Below Best varieties declined, whilst teas at the bottom sold around last levels. A few select Best PEK/PEK1's maintained, whilst all others declined.

In the Tippy catalogues, select Best FBOP's were firm to marginally easier, whilst the balance declined. FF1's too, in general, were easier.

In the Premium catalogues, very Tippy teas together with the smaller varieties declined sharply and at times were unsellable due to a lack of sufficient bids. However, a few leafier varieties sold around last levels on special inquiry, whilst the balance were lower.

- * When compared to 30.03 M/Kgs of April 2021, the same period of 2023 shows a decrease of 5.30 M/Kgs (Refer table below).

- * When compared to 104.54 M/Kgs of January-April 2021, cumulative production of 2023 shows a decrease of 20.46 M/Kgs. On a cumulative basis, whilst all elevations show a decrease over the corresponding period of 2021, green tea production has seen a marginal increase vs. the corresponding period in the previous year (Refer table below).

Uva's - Few select invoices were barely steady,

whilst a majority declined Rs. 50-70 per kg.

BOPF Best Western's - Few select invoices appreciated up to Rs. 100 per kg following special

inquiry, whilst the others were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg lower. In the Below Best category, black neat leaf teas were barely steady, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market declined Rs. 50-70 per kg. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas declined up to Rs. 200 per kg, whilst the others were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Uva's - Few select invoices were Rs. 20-30 per kg easier,

whilst the others declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more.

OP/OPA Well made OP/OPA's together with lower end were easier Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at

times.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 A limited selection of Flavory PEK's that were available were irregularly easier. Orthodox

leafy PEK/PEK1's in general were easier Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times. Best/Below Best varieties were firm to easier apart from select invoices which were dearer by Rs. 50-100 per kg on special inquiry. Other categories remained mostly firm at last week's levels.


