QUALITY

*A small selection of Westerns were improved and overall of a fairly useful standard for the time of year. Nuwara Eliyas together with the Uva/Uda Pussellawas and Low Grown were similar to last.*

## COMMENTS

*Auction volumes totalled 6.5 M/Kgs this week. Improved demand for the better teas, whilst the others met with a bearish market sentiment. The parity between the good teas and their poorer counterparts in almost all categories of tea have widened indicating a dearth of good quality teas and a surfeit of average to plain quality teas.*

*Ex-Estate offerings totalled 0.8 M/Kgs. Overall quality was of a reasonable make for the time of the year.*

*A prolonged period of low volumes perhaps triggered an upward surge in prices particularly for the better teas.*

*Best Western BOP's - Improved teas once again were firm and dearer following special inquiry, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were firm and up to Rs. 20 per kg dearer. In the Below Best category, a selection of improved BOP's gained Rs. 20 per kg and more, whilst the others were irregular. Corresponding BOPF's sold around last week's levels. At the lower end, clean leaf BOP's were firm, whilst the others were barely steady. Corresponding BOPF's gained Rs. 20-30 per kg. Nuwara Eliya BOP's sold well following quality. Corresponding BOPF's had select invoices gaining substantially in value, whilst the others met with better demand and were more saleable this week. Uda Pussellawas' - teas in the higher price bracket were barely steady, whilst the others gained Rs. 20 per kg, on average. Uva - neat leaf BOP/BOPF's gained Rs. 20-30 per kg and Rs. 10-20 per kg respectively, whilst the others were irregular.*

*High and Mid Grown CTC's have made reasonable progress over the past couple of weeks and a further improvement/appreciation of Rs. 20 per kg, on average, this week as well. Corresponding Low Grown types continued to sell well.*

*Low Grown comprised of 2.9 M/Kgs in the Leafy/Semi Leafy and Tippy catalogues. A selection of well-made teas met with fair demand, whilst the others were irregular and mostly easier.*

*In the Leafy catalogues, Select Best BOP1/OP1's were fully firm, whilst a range of improved Below Best varieties gained following quality. Others and poorer sorts maintained. A selection of well-made OP/OPA's maintained, whilst the others declined substantially. Poorer sorts maintained. A few Select Best PEK/PEK1's maintained, whilst the Below Best varieties commenced firm but declined substantially towards the closure of the sale. Others and poorer sorts too followed a similar trend and remained unsold due to a lack of suitable bids.*

*In the Tippy catalogues, well-made FBOP/FF1's together with cleaner varieties maintained, whilst the balance were irregular. Teas at the bottom were firm to selectively dearer.*

*In the Premium catalogues, Very Tippy teas continued to attract good demand. Best and cleaner Below Best appreciated, whilst the balance were irregular.*

*Devaluation of currencies in some tea importer countries combined with shipping-related constraints (increased cost and lack of cargo space) continued to impact on demand at the auctions and as a consequence, certain categories of teas are significantly impacted.*

*Best Western's - Improved teas were once again firm and dearer following special inquiry. In the Below Best category, improved sorts gained Rs. 20 per kg and more, whilst the others were irregular. Plainer sorts - Clean leaf teas were firm, whilst the others were barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's sold well with prices fluctuating following quality. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas were barely steady, whilst teas at the lower end of the market were Rs. 20 per kg dearer. Uva's - Neat leaf teas were Rs. 20-30 per kg dearer, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent.*

**BOPF**

*Best Western's - Improved teas were firm and up to Rs.20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular. Teas in the Below Best category sold around last levels, whilst teas at the lower end gained Rs. 20-30 per kg and more. Nuwara Eliya's - Select invoices were substantially dearer following special inquiry, whilst the others met with better demand and were more saleable this week. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas were barely steady, whilst the others were Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer. Uva's - Better teas were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular.*

OP/OPA

*Best and Below Best OP/OPA's firm on last whilst lower end were dearer Rs. 10-20 per kg.*

**PEKOE/PEKOE1**

*A limited selection of Flavory PEK's that were available were irregularly dearer. Orthodox leafy PEK/PEK1's in general were easier Rs. 10-20 per kg. Better Rotovane PEK's firm. Others sold at last levels.*

**FBOP/FBOPF1**

*A limited selection of Flavoury FBOP's that were available gained sharply. Well-made Orthodox leafy FBOP/FF1's were dearer Rs. 10-20 per kg whilst others at the lower end were dearer Rs. 10 per kg.*

CROP AND WEATHER

For the period 18-24 October 2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions

Clear mornings and dull evenings with showers were reported in the Western Region, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region reported overcast weather condition with occasional spells of bright weather throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, heavy showers and misty conditions are expected in the mornings in the Nuwara Eliya Region in the week ahead.

Uva/Udapussellawa Region

Both regions reported sunny mornings and overcast evenings with rain throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects heavy showers in the Uva Region in the week ahead.

Low Growns

The Low Grown Region reported bright weather, whilst the Sabaragamuwa Region reported occasional showers throughout the week. Heavy showers and misty conditions are expected in the mornings in the Sabaragamuwa Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Crop Intake

The Western High, Uva and Udapussellawa regions reported an increase in the crop intake, whilst the Western Medium, Nuwara Eliya and Low Grown regions maintained.

Fair demand for the 151,420 packages (9,952,602.00 kilos) on offer and 20.45% remained unsold.

LEAF GRADES

Offerings: 75,200 packages (4,884,297.00 kilos). 20.69% were unsold.

The best BP1s available advanced by up to USC12 closely following quality but a few lines shed up to USC2 and a few invoices were unsold with brighter varieties about steady to USC24 below last week's levels and some lines remained unsold; medium types were discounted by USC5 to USC21 and many lines remained without bids but a few improved invoices were firm to USC2 dearer. Lower medium categories were a weak feature easing by USC4 to USC68 and some invoices were unsold but a few improved lines were marginally dearer while plainer descriptions met an irregular interest ranging between USC2 to USC4 above previous prices to easier by USC2 to USC13 with some teas neglected.

Best PF1s in the market shed USC18 to USC26 following quality with brighter varieties easing by USC7 to USC26 while medium types were about steady to USC64 below previous week's rates; lower medium categories were irregular with improved invoices firm to USC16 above last prices but others shed USC2 to USC20. Plainer types saw an irregular activity and varied between steady to USC14 dearer to easier by USC3 to USC19 and many teas were neglected.

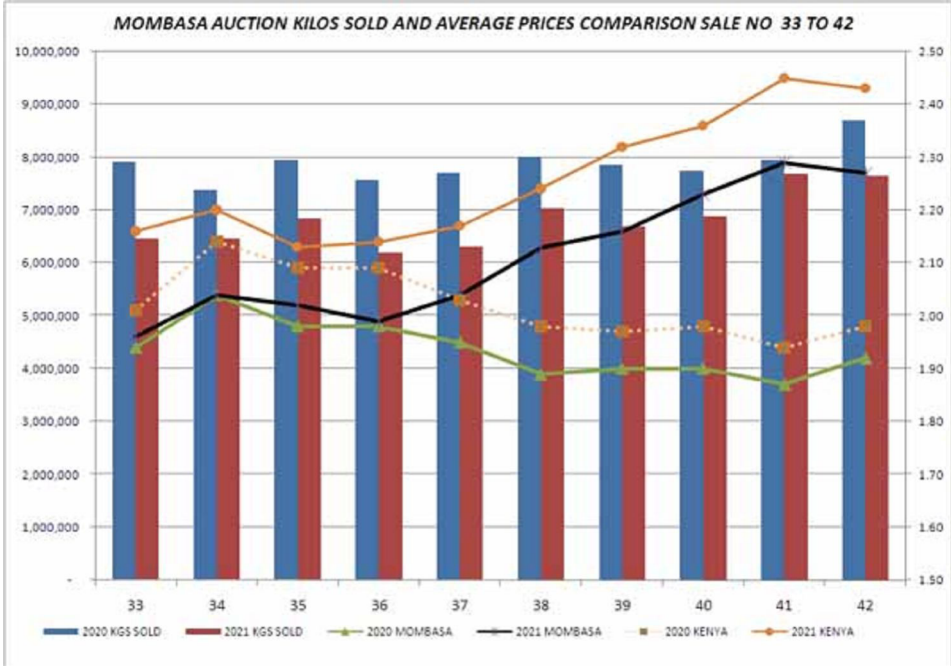

Best PDUSTs in the market eased by USC4 to USC8 with quality while brighter varieties held steady to USC8 below last week's rates with mediums easing by USC17 to USC19 and some invoices remained without bids but a few improved lines were firm to USC6 dearer closely following quality. Lower medium sorts saw an irregular interest and varied between USC2 to USC14 above previous week's levels to easier by USC6 to USC27 and some lines were unsold with plainer types irregular ranging between steady to USC34 dearer to easier by USC3 to USC21 some teas were neglected.The best DUST1s on offer were irregular with quality ranging between firm to USC4 dearer to easier by up to USC8 with brighter types steady on last rates while medium sorts met an irregular enquiry varying between firm to USC2 dearer to easier by USC10 to USC29 and a few invoices remained unsold. Lower medium categories were steady to USC26 below previous week's rates while plainer descriptions were irregular and held firm to USC5 above last prices to easier by USC2 to USC11 easier and many invoices were neglected.
