# **QUALITY**

High & Medium Growns were barely maintained, whilst the Low Growns were similar to last.

#### **COMMENTS**

Sale No. 13 concluded today which had a total of 5.1 M/Kgs brings to a close sales for Q1 2023. There was good general demand. The firm to easier trend in prices would emanate due to qualitative factors combined with less activity due to the commencement of the Ramadan period and restricted purchases on account of stock taking factors due to the end of the financial year.

Ex-Estate offerings comprised of a fairly similar volume and totalled 0.74 M/Kgs. Overall quality in regard to teas in the Western and Nuwara Eliya planting districts were barely maintained, whilst the others were fairly similar to last.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's had a few select invoices which appreciated on account of special inquiry, whilst the others were often firm and easier following quality. In the Below Best category, brighter BOP's were firm and marginally easier, whilst the others declined up to Rs. 100 per kg. Plainer sorts declined further. Corresponding BOPF's - whilst the brighter sorts declined up to Rs. 50 per kg, the others together with teas at the lower end of the market often sold around last week's levels although towards the close prices tend to weaken marginally. Nuwara Eliyas' were irregular following quality. Uda Pussellawas' were generally maintained. Uva BOP's were maintained, whilst the corresponding BOPF's - majority of the teas on offer declined Rs. 50-100 per kg.

CTC teas were generally firm and price declines were reflective of quality.

Low Growns comprised 2.2 M/Kgs. The market met with fair demand at lower levels, particularly for the well-made teas. However, the teas at the bottom continued to sell well.

In the Leafy and Semi Leafy catalogues, OP1's in general were firm. Well-made BOP1's remained firm, whilst the teas at the bottom declined. Well-made OP/OPA's in general eased, whilst the teas at the bottom were firm. However, smaller OP varieties declined substantially. PEK/PEK1's, in general, declined.

In the Tippy catalogues, well-made FBOP/FF1's together with the Below Best were easier, whilst the teas at the bottom sold around last levels.

In the Premium catalogues, high priced Tippy teas were firm on special inquiry, whilst the others in general were lower. However, the leafier varieties were firm to dearer.

**Off Grades** - Better teas were firm and easier, whilst prices at the lower end were often dearer on last.

**Dust** varieties - Best and Below Best primary Dust were often lower, whilst prices for teas at the lower end were often dearer.

The feature of the sale would be the wide spread demand for teas at the lower end and the firm to dearer trend in prices.

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# 20th Inter Plantation Cricket Tournament 2023

The Dimbula Athletic & Cricket Club (DACC) was founded in 1856 for sports activities - Rugby, Cricket, Squash, Billiards/Snooker, Tennis and Badminton and is the 2<sup>nd</sup> oldest Planters' Club in Sri Lanka. The DACC was honoured by a visit to the club by Queen Elizabeth II and His Royal Highness Prince Philip in April 1954 as part of their tour of Ceylon.

In the Below Best category - brighter sorts were firm to marginally easier, whilst the others declined up to Rs. 100 per kg. Plainer sorts eased further. Nuwara Eliya's were irregular. Uda Pussellawa's were firm to dearer, particularly for teas at the lower end. Uva's sold around last.

**BOPF** 

Best Western's - A few select invoices were dearer following special inquiry, whilst the others were mostly firm. In the Below Best category, brighter sorts were up to Rs. 50 per kg lower, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market were generally firm. Nuwara Eliya's - Few select invoices were firm and dearer, whilst the others were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uda Pussellawa's were firm to marginally dearer, particularly for teas at the lower end of the market. Uva's - Coloury invoices were firm, whilst the lighter thinner liquoring teas were irregularly easier.

OP/OPA

Well-made OP/OPA's together with lower end were easier Rs. 50-100 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

A limited selection of Flavory PEK's that were available were irregularly easier. Well-made Orthodox leafy PEK/PEK1's in general were easier Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times. Best Rotavane PEK's were firm to irregularly dearer following quality and special inquiry. Others sold at last levels.

FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of Flavory FBOP's that were available were easier. Well-made Orthodox leafy FBOP/FF1's together with cleaner below best sorts were firm on last. Others at the lower end were irregularly easier.


