COMMENTS

Auction offerings remained around last and totalled 5.5 M/Kgs. Overall demand for the Low Grown/Large Leaf teas showed a slight improvement following improved activity.

Ex-Estate offerings declined quite sharply and totalled 0.68 M/Kgs, down from the 0.8 M/Kgs on offer the previous week. Overall quality of teas showed no significant change.

Improved demand for select invoices in the Best Western category. Also the final offerings of seasonal teas from the Eastern sector continued to witness some useful support and fairly attractive prices were recorded with price variances often reflective of quality. Teas in the middle price bracket, both from the Western and Eastern sector, tend to ease off by Rs. 20-40 per kg particularly for the BOPF grade.

High & Medium Grown CTC teas continued to witness a bearish sentiment with prices often firm to easier on last. Corresponding Low Grown varieties sold firm to dearer, whilst the PF1 grade in particular continued to sell between Rs. 1,450-1,550 per kg levels (approximately USD 5).

Better liquoring teas continued to receive support from the UK, Japan and the continent, whilst shippers to the CIS continued to be active on a wide cross-section of the teas.

Low Growns comprised of 2.5 M/Kgs. The Leafy, Semi-Leafy and Tippy categories met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's were firm, whilst the balance together with the bolder varieties were irregularly lower. Select Best and Best OP1's were dearer, whilst the Below Best and poorer sorts were fully firm. Well-made OP/OPA's appreciated, whilst the Below Best varieties declined. Teas at the bottom were firm. Select Best and Best PEK/PEK1's were dearer, whilst the balance sold around last levels.


Well-made FBOP's together with the cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom were firm, whilst the balance were easier following quality. Select Best and Best FF1's were firm to easier. However, the cleaner Below Best were firm, whilst the balance were irregular following quality.

In the Premium catalogue, Very Tippy teas together with the Best and cleaner Below Best appreciated, whilst the balance were easier following quality.

NATIONAL TEA SALES AVERAGES (AUGUST 2024)



Key Highlights:

- * Total Elevation Average decreased by Rs. 35.39 in comparison to the previous month
- * Cumulative variance recorded a positive Rs. 67.96 and USD 0.51 against January-August 2023
- * Cumulatively, all elevations witnessed an increase in both LKR and USD terms in comparison with the corresponding year
- * National tea sales average for the month of August 2024 recorded Rs. 1,188.49 (USD 3.98), showing a decrease of Rs. 35.39 and USD 0.07 in comparison with the July 2024 average of Rs. 1,223.88 (USD 4.05).
- * In comparison to the August 2023 average of Rs. 1,110.54 (USD 3.47), shows a positive variance of Rs. 77.95 and USD 0.51 YOY.

Elevation-Wise Analysis - August 2024:

- * High Grown average for the month recorded a decrease of Rs. 11.08 and an increase of USD 0.01 month on month, whilst an increase of Rs. 198.16 and USD 0.88 is recorded YOY.
- * Medium Grown average for the month recorded a negative variance of Rs. 38.04 and USD 0.09 month on month. In comparison to the corresponding month last year, shows an increase of Rs. 78.39 and USD 0.48 YOY.
- * Low Grown average for the month recorded a decrease in LKR and USD terms of Rs. 43.22 and USD 0.10 month on month, whilst the YOY average shows an increase of Rs. 45.14 and USD 0.43.
- * All regions recorded positive variances during the period January-August 2024 in comparison to the corresponding period of 2023 in LKR and USD terms.

Teas at the lower end were irregularly lower following quality. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's declined by Rs. 40 per kg and more following quality. Uva's - Seasonal teas declined by Rs. 100-150 per kg and more, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50-60 per kg and more

following quality.

BOPF Best Western's gained by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more following quality, whilst the others sold at last levels. Teas in the

Below Best category, where quality was maintained, gained by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the others declined by a similar margin. Teas at the lower end sold at last levels. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's - Better sorts gained by Rs. 40 per kg, whilst the others which commenced Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer gained further towards the close.

Uva's - Seasonal teas continued to sell at last levels, whilst the others declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg.

 \mathbf{OP}/\mathbf{OPA} OP/OPA's, in general, declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more at times.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 A limited selection of flavoury PEK's declined sharply and were mostly unsold. Orthodox Leafy PEK/PEK1's, in general,

mostly firm on last. Others and poorer sorts were irregularly easier.



CTC LEAF

DEMAND:

Good Demand. However, with the progress of sale though the demand continued to persist the price levels started depleting especially on the medium and plainer sorts which resulted in few out lots.

MARKET:

The total CTC leaf teas sold this week was 87.47% (1,200,204.21kgs) of the total offering of 1,372,122.90kgs. Limited volume of the best liquoring larger broken sold barely steady whilst the medium broken sold irregularly easier. However, the smaller broken and fanning grade sold irregularly dearer following quality and competition. Good teas sold at barely steady levels.
