High & Mid Growns were mostly similar to last, whilst the Low Growns were lower to last.

COMMENTS

The 30th sale of the year concluded this week had on offer a total of 5.8 M/Kgs. Bearish market sentiment perhaps on account of the marginal strengthening of the Sri Lankan Rupee.

Ex-Estate offerings totalled 0.85 M/Kgs, marginally higher to the previous week. Overall quality of teas on offer showed no significant change.

Improved activity for a selection of teas in the Best and Below Best categories following quality, whilst prices for teas at the lower end of the market continued to remain around last week's levels. Once again, Nuwara Eliyas' had hardly any availability of BOP/BOPF's. Uda Pussellawas' were barely maintained. Uva - The limited availability of BOP's appreciated by Rs. 80-100 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's continued to sell around last week's levels.

High & Mid Grown CTC teas witnessed less demand all round. BP1's were mostly unsellable, whilst the PF1's declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more for the poorer types. In the Low Grown segment, here again the BP1's - a majority of the teas remained unsold due to a lack of any suitable bid, whilst the PF1's gained by Rs. 40 per kg and more for select invoices following quality.

Following the dry spell, teas from the Eastern sector are likely to show an improvement in quality from Sale No. 32 onwards and it is envisaged that the Uva Quality Season would be short considering the current climatic conditions experienced in the region.

Low Growns comprised of 2.4 M/Kgs. The Leafy, Semi-Leafy and Tippy categories met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, BOP1's in general maintained. High-priced OP1's were easier, whilst the balance were fully firm. Well-made OP/OPA's were selectively dearer, whilst the balance maintained. Select Best PEK's were firm. The Best together with the Below Best were firm, whilst the bolder varieties appreciated. The balance sold around last levels. PEK1's, in general, were lower.

Select Best FBOP's were firm, whilst the others in general were lower. A few Select Best FF1's sold around last levels, whilst the balance declined.

In the Premium catalogues, Tippy teas declined substantially and were mostly unsellable due to a lack of suitable bids, whilst a few clean leaf Below Best sorts were firm. The balance declined.

COLOMBO INTERNATIONAL TEA CONVENTION 2024

the Below Best category, where quality was maintained, sold at last levels, whilst the others eased by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Teas at the lower end were generally firm. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's - Better sorts were firm to irregularly lower, whilst the others sold at last levels. Uva's - Better varieties were fully firm following

special inquiry, whilst the others were irregularly dearer.

OP/OPA Well-made OP/OPA's were easier by Rs. 50 per kg and more at times, whilst teas at the lower end were firm to easier

by a similar margin.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 A limited selection of flavoury PEK's that were available were firm on last. Well-made Orthodox Leafy PEK's, in

general, were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the PEK1's were firm to easier by Rs. 50 per kg. Select well-made Rotovane PEK's were dearer by Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others sold at last week price levels. Teas at the lower end

met with irregular demand following quality.

FBOP/FBOPF1 A limited selection of flavoury FBOP's were firm on last. Orthodox Leafy FBOP/FF1s, in general, were firm to easier by





However, buyers of each Innovative tea will receive from the Broker 4.5 kg, apart from the casket holding 0.5 kg.

The proceeds will be credited to the account of the Colombo Tea Traders' Charity Trust which has provided valuable assistance, and will continue to do so, to industry personnel, plantation workers, as well as having performed other commendable acts of charity, primarily within the industry.

A special appreciation to the award winners for manufacturing the finest teas in their respective agro-climatic regions and for their generous contribution of 10 kgs of these teas which are offered for sale in this catalogue. Your generosity makes this charity auction a reality.

Tasting Panel Chairman's Message



It was proposed that the Ceylon Speciality Estate Tea of the Year competition 2024 should coincide with the Colombo International Tea Convention to popularise and encourage the concept of marketing teas specifically from the 7 main growing regions, showcasing the diversity of Ceylon Tea, representing single estate garden marks. It was decided that a selection of innovative teas from these very growing regions, too, should be given due recognition, since the hand-made/innovative tea sector has been progressively developing.

Accordingly, teas produced in Nuwara Eliya, Uda Pussellawa, Uva, Dimbula, Kandy, Sabaragamuwa and Ruhuna, the main growing regions, were selected from invoices conventionally catalogued for sale at the Colombo Tea Auction, with the exception of teas in the Green Tea and Innovative Tea categories.

The criteria for qualifying and eventual selection for ranking were the distinctiveness of the unique characteristics of each agro-climatic region from which the teas originated, adherence to the high standards and industry norms in the factories and processing, suitability for the international market and the ability to produce commercial quantities if the need demanded.

Each factory was permitted to submit a single entry which represented a grade of which the leaf structure was in compliance with the description of the Colombo Tea Traders' Association's Grade Nomenclature.

Entries of teas grown at the High and Medium elevations were restricted to OP, OP1, FBOP, Pekoe, BOP and BOPF grades.

Low Grown entries were restricted to OP1, OPA, FBOP1, BOP1, FBOPF1, FBOPFSp, FBOPFExSp, FBOPFExSp1, Pekoe, Pekoe1, BOP and BOPF grades.

For tea manufactured through the CTC process, the approved grades were PF1 and BP1 from each of the 3 elevations.

The Innovative Tea segment was considered as a separate category and only hand-made tea manufacturers registered with the Sri Lanka Tea Board with a HT number were eligible to submit teas for selection.

Each entry was required to submit 4 samples of 50g per grade for evaluation.

Each of the selected entries from the regular grades was required to submit 10 kgs of tea for sale at the charity auction. Similarly, in the Innovative category, the requirement was 5 kgs.

The selection criteria were compiled by an expert panel of industry personnel appointed jointly by the Sri Lanka Tea Board and the Colombo Tea Traders' Association. The panel comprised the following members. I wish to express my gratitude to these gentlemen for their invaluable support.



Conditions of Sale for the Charity Auction

Tea Caskets

- 1. The thirty-nine teas offered are winners of the Ceylon Speciality Estate Tea of the Year Competition 2023/2024.
- 2. The decorative glass framed tea casket will have a metal plate, on which the appropriate text will be laser etched, affixed to its front panel.
- 3. The 39 caskets will each contain 0.5 kg of a different award-winning tea, comprising a range of Orthodox Black Tea, CTC Tea, Ceylon Green Tea and Innovative Tea from each of the 7 agro-climatic regions.
- 4. Each Broker will offer identically packed decorative glass framed tea caskets.
- 5. Rs. 100,000 is the desired commencing bid for each tea. Thereafter, any advance on a previous bid shall be at a minimum rate of Rs. 20,000.
- 6. The fall of the hammer will signify the conclusion of a sale transaction to the buyer declaring the highest bid in each case and will serve as a binding contract. The respective Broker will issue an invoice to the buyer in conformation.
- 7. Payment for each purchase shall be settled for the full value of the sale plus 18% VAT (where applicable) by Thursday, 30th July 2024 at the latest, at the office of the respective Broker.
- 8. On settlement of the full payment, the Broker shall present the buyer the tea casket.

 An additional 9.5 kgs of tea representing the tea in the particular Lot will be handed over to the buyer for the conventional teas and 4.5 kgs for the innovative teas.
- 9. On completion of the sale of each Broker's catalogue, the buyers of the teas sold through the catalogue will be ceremonially awarded a purchase/guarantee certificate.
- 10. Claims and Disputes In the unlikely event of a dispute and/or claim, a panel of Arbitrators nominated by the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce will reach a decision, which shall be binding.







This is the Certification Mark for Tea cultivated, grown and manufactured in the Nuwara Eliya agro-climatic region, situated at approximately 6,000 feet [1,800 metres] above sea level and nestles at almost the apex of the central mountain range of the island. Teas from this region are classified as "high growns", and are considered by tea connoisseurs, in the context of Ceylon Tea, to be what Champagne is to French Wine. The manufacturing process adopted in this salubrious climate creates teas, which, when infused, produce a beverage which is delicately fragrant on the palate and of a pale orange hue.

UDA PUSSELLAWA



This is the Certification Mark for Tea cultivated, grown and manufactured in the Uda Pussellawa agro climatic region, which is located on the eastern slopes of the central mountain ridge and wedged between the Nuwara Eliya and the Uva regions, at an elevation of approximately 3,500 to 5,000 feet [1,100 to 1,500 metres] above sea level. It is reputed for teas of subtle quality, available virtually throughout the year, benefiting from the special conducive conditions of the traditional Eastern Quality Season from July to September, which is its peak period, as well as the dry, cold weather it experiences in the first three months of the year. The infusion of its teas is light and rosy in appearance and carries an exquisitely tangy flavour. Teas in this region are classified as "high growns". There are three sub-regions, namely, Maturata, Ragala and Halgranoya within the Uda Pussellawa agro-climatic region.

DIMBULA



This is the Certification Mark for Tea cultivated, grown and manufactured in the Dimbula agro-climatic region, which covers the extensive western slopes of the central mountain ridge, situated approximately 3,500 to 5,500 feet [1,100 to 1,700 metres] above sea level. Teas from this region are classified as "high growns". The extensive mountain ranges and valleys in this region that cover a vast area are, at the higher end of its elevational scale, at the Western edge of Nuwara Eliya, and encompass such well-known sub-regions as Hatton, Dickoya, Bogawantalawa, Upcot, Maskeliya, Kotagala, Lindula, Talawakelle, Nanuoya, Agarapatana, Punduloya and Ramboda.

The South-West monsoon rains have a significant impact on the quality of Dimbula teas. Low temperatures combined with drought conditions from January to March bring about changes that vary in different valleys. This Western Quality Season produces a range of teas from those with full bodied flavour to light, delicate and fragrant. Dimbula tea enjoys both domestic and international appeal for its unique quality and character, which makes it the most popular amongst the majority of consumers. The infused brew of its teas is bright orange in appearance and refreshingly rich and mellow in taste. Dimbula is, perhaps, the most celebrated name associated with Ceylon Tea.

IJVA



This is the Certification Mark for Tea cultivated, grown and manufactured in the Uva agro-climatic region, which covers a vast extent on the eastern side of the island's central mountain ridge, at approximately 2,500 to 5,000 feet [800 to 1,500 metres] above sea level. Teas in this region are classified, in the main, as "high growns". The extensive mountain ranges and valleys that make up this vast region include many sub-regions that are manifestly different in physical and climatic properties to each of its other plantation areas. The strong desiccating winds that blow over the Uva region create a special character in the tender leaves of the tea bush, which produce an extraordinary flavour and pungency that is uncommon in other tea growing areas of the island. Uva teas have a truly unique flavour and are used in many different blends to enhance their appeal. They achieve their peak quality in the Eastern Quality Season from July to September each year, when its infused teas are of a deep orange hue and are pungent with an exotically aromatic flavour.

The sub-regions of Malwatte, Welimada, Demodera, Hali-Ela, Badulla, Passara, Lunugala, Madulsima, Ella, Namunukula, Bandarawela, Poonagala, Haputale, Koslanda and Haldummulla combine to form this very large agro-climatic region.

KANDY



This is the Certification Mark for Tea cultivated, grown and manufactured in a wide area surrounding the island's ancient hill capital of Kandy; hence the appellation identifying the agro-climatic region. It is located at an elevation from approximately 2,000 to 4,000 feet [600 to 1,200 metres] above sea level. The infused brew of its Black Tea has a reddish tinge and is full-bodied, flavoursome and strong. Teas in this region are classified as "medium grown".

Encompassed by a range of hills that extends from Kandy to the Kotmale and Gampola areas, it experiences weather patterns associated with the limited wind that finds its way through "gaps" and "passes" in the mountain terrain. Its sub-regions are Pussellawa, Hewaheta and Matale.

SABARAGAMUWA



This is the Certification Mark for Tea cultivated, grown and manufactured in the southern part of the island, spread over an extensive area from sea level to an elevation of approximately 2,500 feet [750 metres], comprising various far-flung sub-regions, which include Ratnapura and Balangoda, from the southern plains, through the world renowned heritage rain forest of Sinharaja, up to the southern foothills of the central massif. This tea growing area is collectively referred to as the Sabaragamuwa agro-climatic region. The products from this region are broadly categorized as low-grown teas. With stylish leaf appearance and larger well-twisted particles, the blackness of the dry leaf is a distinctive feature; as are the deep red colour of the infused brew of its Black Tea and its smooth and full bodied liquors. The vigorous growth of the tea bush, due to high rainfall in the Sabaragamuwa region, has resulted in the production of lighter liquoring teas than those from the Ruhuna region, which are mellower than teas from tea plantations situated at lower elevations. Sabaragamuwa tea enjoys both domestic and international preference on account of its subtle character and a leaf style which is unique to the region.

RUHUNA



This is the Certification Mark for Tea cultivated, grown and manufactured in the southern part of the island, spread over an extensive area from sea level to an elevation of approximately 1,500 feet [450 metres]. The sub-regions of Deniyaya, Matara and Galle, stretching from the coastal plains to the southern edge of Sinharaja Rain Forest, collectively form the Ruhuna agro-climatic region. The product from the tea gardens/factories of this region are broadly categorized as "low grown", typically known for their stylish leaf appearance and larger particle size. The southern part of the country has an exclusive soil character that gives blackness to the dry leaf of the product, as well as strength and a distinctive flavour to the infused brew, which is deep red in colour.

CTC (CUT, TEAR, AND CURL)



CTC (Cut, Tear, and Curl) is a method of processing black tea in a manner that is different to the traditional Orthodox Black tea. The freshly picked leaves from the tea bushes, following a degree of withering, are subjected to maceration through a series of cylindrical rollers with serrated blades that cut, tear, and curl the tea into small particles, which, after being passed through the drier, form into even-shaped pellets in 3 sizes. They are sorted through the process of sifting into grades, namely Broken Pekoe [BP], Pekoe Fannings 1 [PF1] and Pekoe Dust [PD]. The manufacturing process is of a briefer duration than that of the Orthodox product and there is far less human intervention than there is in the Orthodox process, which is guided by the perception of manufacturing experts at virtually every stage. CTC teas infuse rapidly into a very strong and coloury brew and the PF1 and PD grades, which areof smaller particle sizes, are much sought after for tea bag blends.

GREEN TEA



The manufacture of Green Tea in the domestic tea industry is relatively new. However, the local manufacturing experts mastered its method of manufacture with alacrity and are now capable of creating a good product of high standard. Both Chinese and Japanese techniques are employed, and a fine Ceylon Green Tea is being produced. Green Tea, which is manufactured in the mid and high elevational regions, infuses a mellow brew, with a pleasing and satisfying flavour, and now competes with the upper end of the Chinese products in quality. Among the varieties produced, Young Hyson, Sowmee, Gun Powder and Sencha have earned popularity with discriminating buyers of Ceylon Tea. The pleasure of tea drinking and the health attributes associated with the consumption of Green Tea have gained global recognition for Ceylon Green Tea, which, in turn, has inspired confidence in the local manufacturers to expand their production of this variety of tea.

SILVER TIP TEAS - WHITE TEAS



Silver Tip Tea is a rare speciality known for the aphrodisiac quality of the brew since the discovery of tea. The most tender buds are hand picked before sunrise, in the misty pre-dawn light by our experienced tea pluckers. These buds are dried to perfection in the delicate crisp morning sunlight to create this speciality tea that served royalty since 2737 BC in the early dynasties of imperial China. Silver Tip is most limited in production and exclusive in quality.



REFRESHING YOU... AND THE OZONE LAYER

All tea grown in Sri Lanka is now one hundred percent ozone-friendly. This is a distinction of which no other tea-producing nation can boast. Plans are now being drawn up to impose a total ban on methyl bromide use in applications like export packaging and shipping. As of May 2011, all Ceylon Tea is entitled to bear the new 'Ozone Friendly Pure Ceylon Tea' logo, certifying that it has been produced without the use of any ozone-depleting substances. The Tea Board has already registered the logo in 9 of the 30 major Ceylon Tea importing countries at present. They are Japan, Malaysia, Kuwait, Syria, UAE, Lebanon, Russia, Chile, Jordan. The registration in the other countries are being processed at present. When you reach for a cup of Ceylon Tea, you're not just refreshing yourself; you're also helping refresh and renew an environmental resource critically important to all life on Earth.















CERTIFICATION MARKS AND IDENTIFICATION LOGOS FOR THE SEVEN AGRO-CLIMATIC REGIONS

The Certification Marks and distinctive logos for each region, to facilitate visual identification, professionally designed to symbolize the heritage of each district have been registered with the Intellectual Properties Authority of the country. The illustration of "two leaves and a bud" has been incorporated in each design.

REGISTER OF FACTORIES

The factories in each of the seven main Agro-Climatic Regions are recorded in a Register maintained by the Sri Lanka Tea Board, the State Regulatory Authority for the Tea Industry, so as to ensure that the composition and boundaries of each region are clearly defined.

SPECIFICITY OF THE PRODUCT

The naturally occurring organoleptic qualities and characteristics typical of tea cultivated, grown and produced in the seven major Agro-Climatic Regions, for which they have acquired an international reputation, distinguished by the particle size and style of its dry leaf, from the smallest to long twisted leaf teas, and by the unique character of its infused brew, from a light, fragrant beverage to those with strength, flavour, aroma and colour, are necessarily subjective in nature, as it is in respect of most food and beverage items. Tea is evaluated by four of the five sensory faculties of human beings; i.e. sight/vision, touch, smell and taste. The senses of smell and taste play a critical role, particularly, in the case of the infused brew, where essential or distinctive attributes of fragrance, quality, flavour, aroma and strength are determined by perceptions of individual preferences and cannot be specifically defined or precisely described within strict technical parameters. Establishing specificity is impossible and impractical for a beverage like Ceylon Tea, with its virtual infinite diversity of natural qualities and characteristics.
