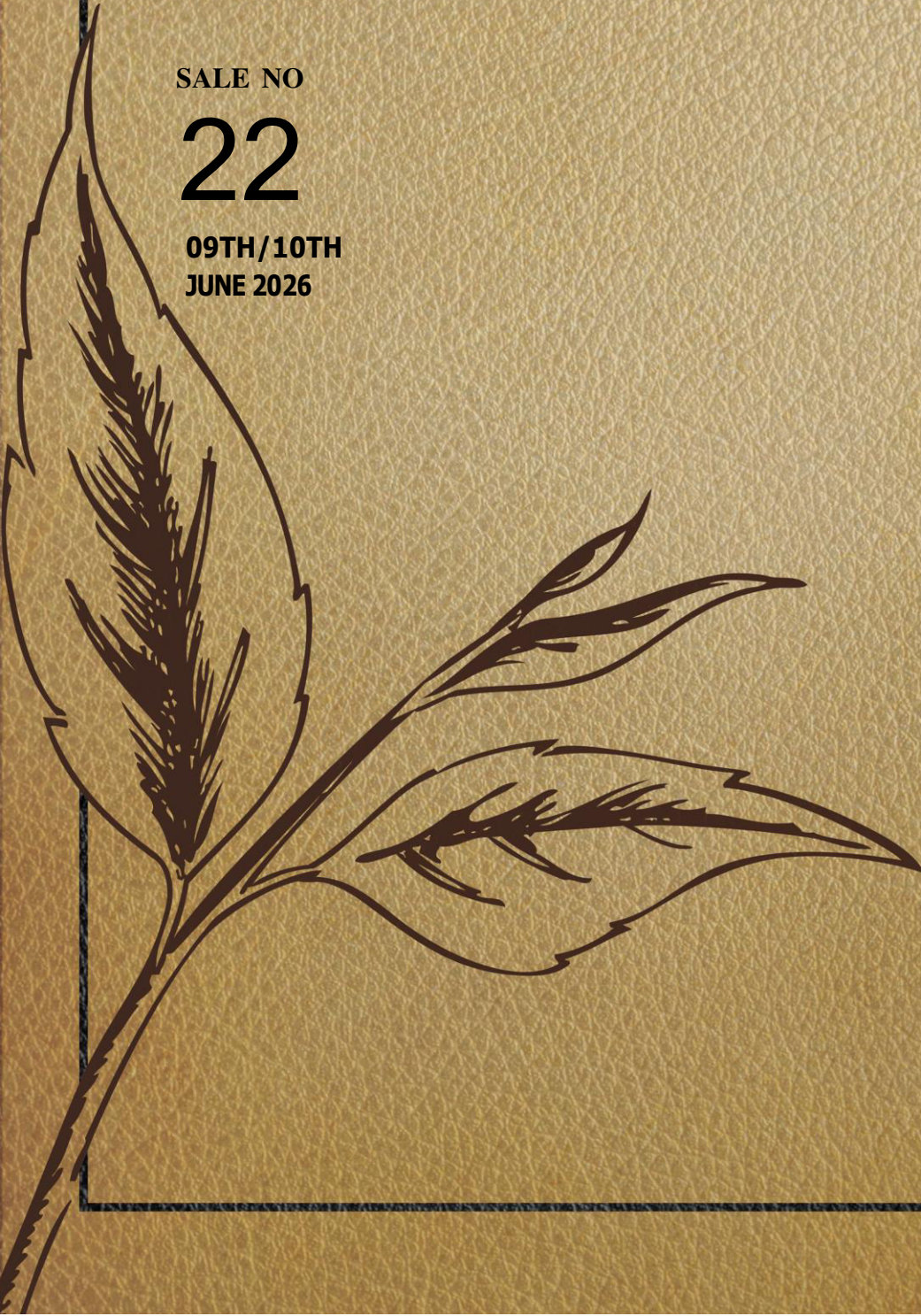

Quality

High & Mid Grown were barely maintained with a greater availability of the offerings comprising of plainer to fair average quality teas, whilst the Low Grown were similar to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings recorded a further increase and totalled 6.4 M/Kgs. Leafy and Semi-Leafy teas in the Mid and Low Grown elevations continued to meet with good demand realising satisfactory prices for the time of year. High & Mid Grown Orthodox Rotovane BOP/BOPF's witnessed a bearish market sentiment more so towards the close of the sale as the USD/LKR spot rate plunged 2.4% to Rs. 329 in early hours of trading after the Central Bank imposed new forex conversion rules on exporters yesterday.

Ex-Estate offerings increased marginally and totalled 1.0 M/Kgs. Once again, overall quality was barely maintained with a greater availability of teas comprising of plain to fair average quality teas. Demand continued to be centered around teas which possessed a good cup colour and strength, whilst those with light and thin liquors were often discounted. Teas at the bottom end of market commenced firm to marginally easier and declined further towards the close with unsold volume progressively increasing.

Most impacted sector would be the High & Medium Grown CTC teas with a greater majority of the offerings remaining unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. However, corresponding Low Grown varieties continued to sell well.

Less activity as the US/Iran conflict continues to dampen market activity primarily emanating from shipping and logistics constraints.

Low Grown totalled approximately 2.5 M/Kgs. Fair demand was witnessed in the Leafy, Semi-Leafy and Tippy categories, whilst the Premium category met with good demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, high-priced BOP1's/OP1's declined, whilst the balance sold around last levels. A selection of high-priced OPA's appreciated following special inquiry, whilst the balance together with the OP's were easier. Select Best and Best PEK's together with cleaner Below Best were firm to dearer, whilst the balance were easier. Well-made PEK1's were irregular, whilst the balance were lower.

In the Tippy catalogue, Select Best FBOP's appreciated, whilst the balance sold around last levels. Well-made FF1's were firm, whilst the others were irregular following quality.

In the Premium catalogue, Tippy teas in general appreciated.

Better Western's - A few select coloury invoices gained by up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others were irregular and mostly easier. In the Below Best category, teas in the higher price bracket declined by up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the others were lower to a lesser extent. Prices at the lower end of the market were barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Uva's were barely steady.

BOPF

Better Western's - A selection of teas gained by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. In the Below Best category, teas in the higher price bracket were irregular following quality, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end of the market were barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were sharply lower. Uva's, where quality was maintained, prices were barely steady, whilst the others were irregular and easier following quality.

OP/OPA

Well-made varieties were firm to easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the Below Best types together with the others and poorer sorts were easier by Rs. 30-50 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

Flavoury PEK/PEK1's were discounted. Select Best PEK1's were firm to easier by Rs. 30-50 per kg, whilst the Select Best PEK's declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Below Best PEK/PEK1's were firm on last levels, whilst the poorer sorts were firm to lower by Rs. 20-30 per kg. Select Best Rotovane PEK's were irregularly lower following special inquiry, whilst the others sold at last levels. Below Best too followed a similar trend, whilst the poorer sorts were irregular and mostly discounted.

FBOP/FBOPF1

Flavoury FBOP/FF1's appreciated following special inquiries, whilst the Better Orthodox FBOP/FF1's were firm to easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Below Best and other Orthodox FBOP's were lower by Rs. 20-40 per kg. FBOPF1's were firm to dearer by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the poorer types were easier by Rs. 20-30 per kg.

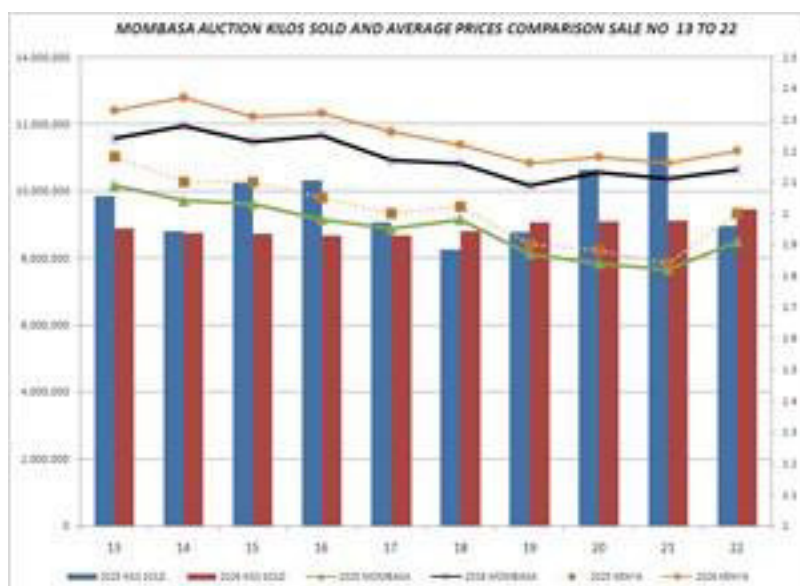
