COMMENTS

Auction offerings increased to 6.2 M/Kgs, highest on offer since Sale No. 4 of 24/25 January 2023 (Quantity 6.7 M/Kgs). There was fair demand at firm to easier rates.

Ex-Estate offerings increased to 0.95 M/Kgs and here again, an increased volume in offerings since Sale No. 21 of 31 May/1 June 2022 (Quantity 0.99 M/Kgs). Overall quality was lower to last with a greater majority of offerings comprising of fair average quality teas.

The better Western BOP/BOPF's continued to sell reasonably well around last week's levels, whilst the other BOP/BOPF's declined Rs. 50 per kg and Rs. 50-100 per kg respectively in most instances with the market weakening to some extent as the sale progressed.

High & Medium Grown CTC teas - BP1's were irregular, whilst the PF1's declined Rs. 100 per kg particularly for the teas in the higher price bracket. Corresponding Low Grown BP1's continued to sell well around last week's levels, whilst the PF1's declined Rs. 50-100 per kg.

Widespread demand particularly from shippers to the CIS followed by Japan and South Africa.

Low Growns comprised of 2.5 M/Kgs. Leafy, Semi Leafy and Tippy catalogues met with lower demand. There was better demand from shippers to the Russian continent, whilst Türkiye, Syria and Iran were very selective.

In the Leafy and Semi Leafy catalogues, OP1's in general were firm. However, BOP1's in general declined. Well-made OP/OPA's together with the Below Best were easier. Teas at the bottom maintained. A selection of Select Best PEK/PEK1's were firm, whilst the balance declined.

In the Tippy catalogues, select Best FBOP's were irregularly easier, whilst the Best, Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom were firm to dearer. Balance were easier following quality. FF1's, in general, were easier.

In the Premium catalogues, a selection of high-priced leafier varieties were firm, whilst the balance declined substantially and were mostly unsellable due to a lack of sufficient bids.

Fair demand mostly at easier rates.

BOP

Best Western's - Few select invoices were barely steady, whilst the others declined up to Rs. 50 per kg following quality. In the Below Best category, a selection of coloury teas were firm, whilst the others particularly the thinner liquoring teas declined up to Rs. 50 per kg. Plainer sorts which were firm at the commencement declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg by the close Nuwara Eliya's were irregular and barely steady. Uda Pussellawa's were mostly firm. Uva's - Clean leaf teas were mostly firm, whilst the others which were Rs. 50 per kg easier at the commencement of the sale declined up to Rs. 100 per kg and more by the close.

BOPF

Best Western's - Select invoices were firm, whilst the others declined up to Rs. 50 per kg. Teas in the Below Best category which commenced Rs. 50-70 per kg easier, eased further as the sale progressed. Plainer sorts which commenced around last week's closing levels were often neglected by the close and mostly unsold. Nuwara Eliya's were generally firm. Uda Pussellawa's were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Uva's which were Rs. 50 per kg easier at the commencement of the sale declined up to Rs. 100 per kg and more by the close.

OP/OPA

Well made OP/OPA's together with lower end were easier Rs. 50 per kg and more at times.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

A limited selection of Flavory PEK's that were available were irregular. Orthodox leafy PEK/PEK1's in general were easier Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times. A few Best rotorvane PEK's sold at last levels following quality and special inquiry. Balance irregularly lower. Others and poorer sorts declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg and more.

FBOP/FBOPF1

A limited selection of Flavory FBOP's that were available were unsellable. Well made Orthodox leafy FBOP/FF1's together with cleaner below best sorts were easier Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times. Others at the lower end were irregularly easier and difficult of sale.

Poorer sorts, in general, were irregularly easier.

Best varieties, in general, maintained. The Below Best varieties were easier by Rs. 10-20 per kg, whilst the poorer sorts maintained.

Best High and Medium Grown CTC's declined by Rs. 50-70 per kg and more at times. Below Best varieties and the poorer sorts declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Low Grown CTC's met with very poor demand which resulted in most teas being unsold at the auction.

Cleaner secondaries were mostly firm, whilst the poorer sorts declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Best Low Grown varieties were firm to dearer by Rs. 25-50 per kg, whilst the poorer sorts were mostly firm.


