COMMENTS

Total auction offerings crossed the 6.0 M/Kgs mark and totalled a 6.45 M/Kgs this week. The highest quantity on offer since Sale No. 5 of 5 February 2025 (6.5 M/Kgs). Overall, a firm to easier trend in prices with the liquoring Small Leaf teas discounted by a higher margin.

Ex-Estate offerings increased to 0.95 M/kgs. Overall quality was mostly lower to last.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's - Select high-priced teas declined by Rs. 100 per kg and more, whilst the others declined to a lesser extent. In the Below Best category, BOP's were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg easier, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more following quality. At the lower end, BOP's were irregular with some correction in prices observed, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more following quality. Nuwara Eliya BOP's were mostly unsold and where sold, declined by up to Rs. 200 per kg. Corresponding BOPF's sold at firm to dearer rates. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were firm and Rs. 20-30 per kg easier, whilst the Uva BOP's declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg. Corresponding BOPF's - Uda Pussellawa's declined by Rs. 50-70 per kg, whilst the Uva's declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg.

High Grown CTC - BP1's had hardly any offerings, whilst the PF1's declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg. Medium Grown CTC's were irregular though reasonable steady, whilst the Low Growns were firm and tended dearer for the PF1's.

Low Growns comprised of 2.6 M/Kgs. All categories met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, Select Best and Best BOP1's were firm, whilst the balance together with the bolder varieties were irregularly easier. Well-made OP1's were easier, whilst the balance appreciated. A few high-priced OP's were dearer, whilst the balance sold around last levels. Select Best OPA's declined, whilst the balance were firm. However, teas at the bottom appreciated. PEK/PEK1's, in general, were firm.

In the Tippy catalogue, high-priced FBOP's were easier, whilst the Best together with the Below Best varieties were firm. Teas at the bottom appreciated. However, the bolder varieties declined. FF1's, in general, were firm.

In the Premium catalogue, a selection of Very Tippy teas were firm, whilst the Best and cleaner Below Best were firm to easier. The balance declined.

World Tea News

Kenya's tea industry generated US\$1.93 B in 2024

Kenya's tea production saw a notable increase in 2024, rising to 598 million kilograms, up from 570 million kilograms in the previous year.

Tea exports contributed Kes 215 billion (US\$1.66B), while local sales accounted for Kes 18 billion (US\$139.26M). Additionally, Kes 18 billion came from committed tea sales.

Pakistan remains the largest importer of Kenyan tea, followed by Egypt, the U.K., and the U.A.E.

To address market challenges, factories were also encouraged to enhance tea quality, and directors were tasked with working closely with brokers to establish competitive pricing strategies.

To further strengthen the tea sector, the government pledged to review levies and taxes on tea, aiming to promote value addition industries. Financial assistance was also committed to help older factories upgrade their operations.

were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier.

BOPF Best Western's - Select high-priced teas declined by Rs. 100-200 per kg, whilst the others declined by Rs. 50-100 per

kg. Teas in the Below Best and Plainer categories declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more following quality. Nuwara Eliya's - A few select invoices sold at firm to dearer rates, whilst the others were difficult of sale. Uda Pussellawa's declined

by Rs. 50-70 per kg. Uva's were Rs. 20-40 per kg lower.

OP/OPA Select Best teas were dearer by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Best and Below Best varieties declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst the

poorer sorts were firm to dearer by Rs. 40 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 A few flavoury PEK's were firm, whilst the others were easier by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst the Orthodox Leafy PEK's

were easier by a similar margin. Well-made PEK1 types which were firm to dearer by Rs. 30-50 per kg at the commencement of the sale, declined towards the closure by Rs. 50-70 per kg. Below Best and the others were discounted by Rs. 50-80 per kg and more at times. Best Rotovane PEK's gained by Rs. 20-40 per kg on select invoices,

whilst the others were firm. Best and Below Best varieties declined by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times.

FBOP/FBOPF1 Flavoury FBOP's were firm to irregularly dearer by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst the Orthodox Leafy FBOP's were firm.


