COMMENTS

Auction offerings totalled 7.0 M/Kgs this week, a significantly higher volume from the 5.1 M/Kgs on offer the previous week. This is the highest volume on offer since Sale No. 20 of 23/24 May 2023. There was fair demand.

Ex-Estate offerings too recorded an increase over last and totalled 1.14 M/Kgs. There was less demand with overall quality showing a further decline.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's - A selection of better teas were firm to dearer by Rs. 20 per kg, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. BOP/BOPF's in the Below Best category too were easier by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst teas at the lower end declined further. Nuwara Eliya BOP/BOPF's were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP/BOPF's - A few Select Best invoices sold well following special inquiry, whilst the others and teas at the bottom declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more.

High Grown CTC teas - BP1's had hardly any offerings. Better PF1's declined by approximately Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the others sold around last levels. Medium Grown BP1's - Better teas continued to sell well, whilst the others were mostly lower. PF1's were mostly unsold and where sold, were Rs. 20-40 per kg lower. Corresponding Low Grown varieties - BP1's gained by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst PF1's declined by a similar margin.


Low Growns comprised of 2.9 M/Kgs. All categories met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's were firm to dearer, whilst the balance together with the bolder varieties were easier. OP1's in general were firm, whilst OP's were easier. Select Best OPA's recorded a noticeable decline, whilst the Best and Below Best varieties too were easier to a lesser extent. Teas at the lower end maintained at last levels. Select Best PEK's appreciated, whilst the balance were lower. However, teas at the bottom sold around last levels. PEK1's, in general, were firm to dearer.

In the Tippy catalogue, FBOP's were maintained at last levels, whilst the bolder varieties were irregular following quality. FBOPF1's, in general, were firm.

In the Premium catalogue, Very Tippy teas met with good demand and were firm, whilst the Best together with Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom sold at last levels. Balance were irregular following quality.

- ▶ Production for the Month was recorded at 26.39 M/Kgs in April 2025 (14.93 M/Kgs)
- > All Elevations recorded positive variances against the corresponding period in 2024 on both a monthly and cumulative basis with the Mid Grown elevation recording the highest increases of 51.77% and 20% respectively vis-à-vis 2024.

- * Sri Lanka Tea Production for the month of April 2025 totalled 26.39 M/Kgs, showing an increase of 4.93 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 21.46 M/Kgs of April 2024. All elevations record an increase, in comparison with the corresponding month of 2024.
- * Compared to 25.24 M/Kgs of April 2023, the corresponding month in the year 2025 shows an increase of 1.15 M/Kgs (Refer table below).

On a cumulative basis, the High and Mid Grown elevations recorded increases, whilst the Low Grown elevation and Green Tea segment have shown negative variances when compared with the same period in the year 2023 (Refer table below).

- * Cumulative Exports totalled 81.41 M/Kgs (Increase of 2.71 M/Kgs YoY) in comparison with January-April 2024 total of 78.70 M/Kgs
- * F.O.B Value for the month recorded Rs. 1,760.31 (USD 5.90), recording an increase of Rs. 14.86 (Gain of USD 0.07) against April 2024. Cumulative FOB Value declined by Rs. 28.75 in comparison with the corresponding period of 2024, whilst the to date USD earnings continued to show an overall improvement in all categories
- * Iraq continues to maintain the top position amongst leading importer countries of Ceylon Tea for the year, whilst Libya makes significant improvement to secure 2nd place edging over Russia

April 2025/2024

* Tea Exports for the month of April 2025 totalled 18.20 M/Kgs, showing an increase of 1.82 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 16.38 M/Kgs of April 2024. All categories have recorded positive variances, except for the Tea in Bulk category. FOB value in April 2025 was recorded at Rs. 1,760.31, an increase of Rs. 14.86 YoY compared to Rs. 1,745.45 of April 2024. In USD terms, however, the month of April witnessed an increase of USD 0.07 in comparison with the corresponding period in the year 2024 (Refer table below).

Tea Packets, Tea Bags and Instant Tea segments have recorded positive variances, whilst the Tea in Bulk and Green Tea categories witnessed a decline against the same period of the previous year.
- * FOB value for the period stood at Rs. 1,743.61, a decrease of Rs. 28.75 (increase of USD 0.15) vis-à-vis Rs. 1,772.36 of January-April 2024.
- * All categories except for Instant Tea recorded negative variances in LKR terms in FOB value, whilst gains were recorded in USD terms in all categories when compared to the corresponding period in 2024 (Refer table below).

Iraq ranks at No. 01 amongst major importers of Ceylon Tea with a total of 11.52 M/Kgs, an increase of 13% YoY in January-April 2025 against the previous year's 10.23 M/Kgs. Libya ranks in 2nd Place with 7.61 M/Kgs, an improvement of 353% surpassing Russia at 3rd place who has witnessed a significant decline of 9% YoY with 7.50 M/Kgs vis-à-vis 8.27 M/Kgs recorded in 2024. The U.A.E is place at No. 4 with 5.52 M/Kgs (35% decrease YoY) followed by Türkiye 4.29 M/Kgs (19% decrease YoY), Iran 4.09 M/Kgs (1% decrease YoY). Chile has secured 7th position with 3.77 M/Kgs edging over China 3.15 M/Kgs, Saudi Arabia 2.89 M/Kgs followed by Germany at 2.73 M/Kgs for January-April 2025.

Teas at the lower end which commenced Rs. 40-60 per kg lower, declined further towards the close. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uda Pussellawa's - Better teas declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more, whilst the others declined to a lesser extent. Uva's - A few invoices sold around last levels following special inquiry, whilst the others declined by Rs. 40 per kg and more.

OP/OPA

Well-made varieties declined by Rs. 50-70 per kg, whilst the others and poorer sorts were firm to easier by Rs. 20 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

Flavoury PEK's were easier by Rs. 60-100 per kg. Orthodox Leafy PEK's were firm to dearer by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Best PEK1's were firm to easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the others decline by Rs. 60-100 per kg. A few Best Rotovane PEK's sold at last levels following quality/special inquiry, whilst the balance declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more. Others and poorer sorts declined further following quality.




