COMMENTS

Auction offerings totalled 6.6 M/Kg. Large Leaf teas met with reasonably good demand except for the PEK grade. High & Medium Small Leaf teas continued to be weak and a bearish sentiment all round primarily following plainer quality.

Ex-Estate offerings were similar to last and totalled 1.0 M/Kgs. Overall quality of teas showed no change with a greater majority of the offerings comprising of average to plain quality teas.

A few select BOP/BOPF's in the higher price bracket in the Western category were firm and dearer following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular and easier. In the Below Best category, a small selection of BOP's appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others declined by a similar margin. Corresponding BOPF's too followed a similar trend. At the lower end BOP's were firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were irregular and mostly easier following quality. Nuwara Eliya BOP's were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier, whilst the corresponding BOPF's continued to sell around last. Uda Pussellawa BOP's - A few clean leaf teas continued to sell well, whilst the others too were firm and marginally dearer. Corresponding BOPF's were barely steady. Uva BOP's were firm and Rs. 20-30 per kg dearer, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined by a similar margin and more.

CTC teas - BP1's had hardly any offerings all round. High & Mid Grown PF1's in the higher price bracket were weaker by up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others continued to sell around last. Corresponding Low Grown PF1's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more.

Less activity from shippers to the UK and the continent, whilst there was selective buying from shippers to Japan and South Africa. Shippers to the CIS and Middle East continued to be active at lower levels.

Low Growns comprised of 2.9 M/Kgs. The Leafy, Semi-Leafy and Tippy catalogues met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's witnessed firm demand, whilst the balance together with the bolder varieties declined. OP1's were generally firm. Well-made OP's sold around last levels, whilst the balance were easier. Select Best OPA's appreciated, whilst the Best and Below Best varieties were lower. Teas at the bottom sold at last levels. High-priced PEK's appreciated, whilst the balance were lower. However, teas at the bottom sold around last levels. PEK1's, in general, were firm.

In the Tippy catalogue, Select Best FBOP's were firm, whilst the Best, Below Best and bolder varieties were easier. Balance sold around last levels. A few Select Best FBOPF1's

were firm, whilst the balance together with the Best and Below Best were easier. Teas at the bottom were firm on last.

In the Premium catalogue, a selection of high-priced Leafier Tippy teas held firm, whilst the balance eased.

In the Below Best category, a selection of teas appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more following special inquiry, whilst the others declined by a similar margin and more. Teas at the lower end of the market were firm and Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer. Nuwara Eliya's were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier. Uda Pussellawa's - A few select clean leaf teas continued to sell well at firm to marginally dearer rates, whilst the others which commenced firm appreciated by Rs. 20-30 per kg as the sale progressed. Uva's were firm and Rs. 20-30 per kg dearer.

BOPF

Best Western's - A few select invoices appreciated following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular and easier following quality. In the Below Best category, a few select invoices were Rs. 20-40 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregular and easier. Plainer sorts were irregular and easier following quality. Nuwara Eliya's sold around last. Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's were up to Rs. 50 per kg easier.

OP/OPA

Well-made varieties declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst the others and poorer sorts were easier by Rs. 60-80 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

Flavoury PEK's declined in demand and were mostly unsold. Orthodox Leafy PEK's were lower by Rs. 60-80 per kg. Best PEK1's were easier by Rs. 40 per kg, whilst the others decline by Rs. 60-80 per kg. A selection of Best Rotovane PEK's gained considerably following special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular and mostly lower following quality. Poorer sorts followed a similar trend.

FBOP/FBOPF1

Select Best flavoury FBOP's declined in demand and were mostly unsold. Better Orthodox FBOP's were firm to marginally easier, whilst the FBOPF1's were lower by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more at times. Below Best FBOP/FBOPF1's were easier by Rs. 40 per kg, whilst the teas at the lower end declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg.

MARKET: - The total CTC leaf teas sold this week was 68.73 %(1,280,621.31kgs) of the total offering of 1,863,312.73Kgs.

BEST:- Best liquoring larger broken sold irregularly following quality, medium and smaller broken grades sold dearer following quality. There were very limited fanning grade on offer. Local and Regional packagers continued to be fairly active.

GOOD:- Larger broken sold barely steady, medium and smaller broken at the bottom end sold barely steady whilst select few invoices sold dearer following quality. Very limited fanning grade was on offer and fetched dearer prices following quality and competition. Regional packagers, upcountry buyers were fairly active.

BETTER MEDIUM & MEDIUM:- Larger broken eased by Rs 4 to 6, The top end medium and smaller broken sold barely steady to easier by Rs 2 to 3 whilst the bottom end in this category declined sharply by Rs 4 to 6. The prices continued to show no disparity between both the categories especially on the medium and smaller broken grades.
