High & Mediums Growns showed a marginal improvement, whilst the Low Growns were similar to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings totalled 6.4 M/Kgs, marginally lower to the 6.5 M/Kgs on offer the previous week. Following the Iran-Israel ceasefire, a greater degree of stability was witnessed in the market and an upward trend in prices all round.

Ex-Estate offerings totalled 0.83 M/Kgs and here again, marginally lower to the 0.86 M/Kgs on offer the previous week. Overall quality of teas on offer were slightly preferable to last.

Improved demand, particularly for the better Westerns, which appreciated by Rs. 50-100 per kg and more. Prices at the lower end of the market for the BOP's were weak and were firm to Rs. 50 per kg easier in most instances. Corresponding BOPF's often appreciated by a similar margin widening the price parity at the lower end between BOP/BOPF's greatly in favour of the latter. Nuwara Eliya BOP/BOPF's were mostly unsold in the backdrop of weak quality. Uda Pussellawas' were firm and easier, whilst the Uva BOP/BOPF's were firm and dearer and here again, particularly for BOPF grade.

CTC teas - BP1's had hardly any offerings. PF1's - High & Mid Growns were firm and up to Rs. 50 per kg dearer for the better teas, whilst the Low Growns continued to sell well at firm to marginally dearer rates.

It was heartening to witness the better teas realising substantial price gains vis-à-vis their poorer counterparts and a significant price parity between the two would certainly be of encouragement to producers of good quality teas.

Selective buying on account of shippers to the UK and the continent. Shippers to Japan, China and South Africa were reasonably active, whilst shippers to the CIS and the Middle East lent good support.

From a global perspective, there appears to be a dearth of good quality teas vis-à-vis the plainer/poorer counterparts and in these circumstances with overall volumes showing a decline, tea prices are likely to remain buoyant in the forthcoming sales.

Low Growns totalled approximately 2.5 M/Kgs. All categories met with good demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, Select Best and Best BOP1's were firm to dearer, whilst the balance together with the bolder varieties sold around last levels. Well-made OP1's appreciated, whilst the balance eased. Well-made OP's together with cleaner Below Best and shorter varieties were dearer. However, the balance together with the mixed/open varieties were irregular. Well-made OPA's were dearer, whilst the balance maintained at last levels. Select Best and Best PEK's were firm to dearer, whilst the balance together with the mixed/open varieties were easier. Teas at the bottom sold around last levels. Well-made PEK1's appreciated, whilst the balance sold around last levels.

In the Tippy catalogue, well-made FBOP's together with the cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the bottom appreciated, whilst the balance were firm on last. Select Best FF1's were firm, whilst the Best and Below Best varieties together with cleaner teas at the bottom were dearer. The balance sold around last levels.

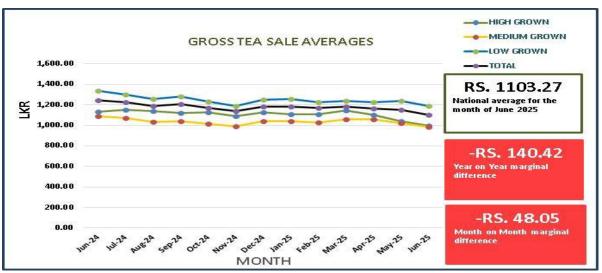
In the Premium catalogue, Very Tippy teas together with the Best and Below Best varieties met with good demand and were dearer, whilst the balance too appreciated to a lesser extent.

- * National tea sales average for the month of June 2025 recorded Rs. 1,103.27 (USD 3.68), recording a decline of Rs. 48.05 (USD 0.17) in comparison with the May 2025 average of Rs. 1,151.32 (USD 3.85).
- * In comparison to the June 2024 average of Rs. 1,243.69 (USD 4.09), shows a decline of Rs. 140.42 (USD 0.41) YOY.
- * Total National Sale Average for the year 2025 (to-date) was recorded at Rs. 1,158.54 (USD 3.89), a decline of Rs. 107.13 (USD 0.23) against the corresponding year's average of Rs. 1,265.67 (USD 4.12).

Elevation-Wise Analysis - June 2025:

- * High Grown average in June 2025 recorded a decrease of Rs. 41.79 and USD 0.15 month on month, whilst a decline of Rs. 136.15 and USD 0.41 was witnessed vis-à-vis June 2024.
- * Medium Grown average in June 2025 recorded a negative variance of Rs. 37.70 and USD 0.13 month on month, whilst a decline of Rs. 100.69 and USD 0.29 was witnessed vis-à-vis June 2024.
- * Low Grown average in June 2025 recorded a decrease of Rs. 53.31 and USD 0.18 month on month, whilst showing a decrease of Rs. 149.46 and USD 0.44 vis-à-vis June 2024.
- * All regions recorded negative variances during the period January-June 2025 in comparison to the cumulative corresponding period of 2024 both in LKR and USD terms.

World Tea News

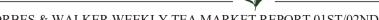
Kenya tea crop down by 18% in 1Q 2025

Kenya's tea production declined by 18.8 percent in the first quarter of 2025 due to unfavorable weather conditions. The country produced 136.91 million kilograms of tea during the period, down from 168.76 million kilograms in the same period in 2024. The drop was largely attributed to extremely hot and dry conditions, coupled with a delayed onset of the long rain season, which typically runs from March to May.

Production for the whole year is projected at 580 million kilograms, which will be lower compared to 594 million kilograms in 2024 but slightly higher than 570 million kilograms in 2023.

Kenya's tea-growing regions are primarily located in the central and Rift Valley areas, with the latter experiencing the most significant decline in Output. Revenue from tea exports fell by 20 percent in the first quarter, totaling 46.07 billion shillings (about 361 million U.S. dollars).

Bright weather was reported from the Uva and Uda Pussellawa regions throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, showers are expected in both regions in the week ahead.

Low Growns



The Low Grown Region reported bright mornings and occasional evening showers throughout the week. Fairly strong winds are expected in the Low Grown Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology.

Crop

The Nuwara Eliya Region maintained the crop intake, whilst the Western, Uva, Uda Pussellawa and Low Grown regions reported a decrease.

following quality/special inquiry, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. At the lower end of the market, select coloury teas appreciated by up to Rs. 50 per kg, whilst the others were irregular. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Uva's - Select high-priced teas of last week were

generally firm, whilst the other clean leaf coloury sorts gained by up to Rs. 100 per kg.

OP/OPA Well-made varieties were firm, whilst the others and poorer sorts were dearer by Rs. 20 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 Flavoury PEK's declined by Rs. 40-60 per kg and were mostly unsold, whilst the Orthodox Leafy PEK's gained by Rs. 40

per kg. Best PEK1's appreciated by Rs. 40-60 per kg. Best Rotovane PEK's sold at last levels, whilst the others declined

and were mostly unsold.

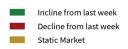

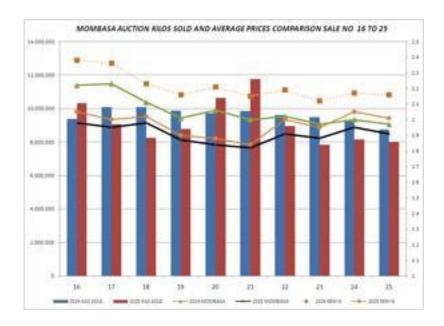

The total CTC leaf teas sold this week was 66.30%(1,278,830.61kgs) of the total offering of 1,928,748.15Kgs Demand:- Good for the Best, good & better medium, subdued for the medium and plainer.

Market:- Good demand prevailed for the best & good category teas with prices at irregular levels based on quality. Few invoices of better medium category fetched handsome gains on competition. Medium and plainer teas continue to see a decline in prices with few blacker fanning grade selling at steady prices.
