Quality

Westerns were irregular, whilst the Nuwara Eliyas were not up to expectations. A small selection of Uvas were improved, whilst the others together with the Uda Pussellawas showed no change. Low Growns were similar to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings totalled 6.0 M/Kgs. Low Grown/Large Leaf teas continued to meet with good demand, whilst the High & Mid Grown liquoring BOP/BOPF's encountered less demand to last.

Ex-Estate offerings were maintained around 0.75 M/Kgs. Overall quality of teas from the Western slopes perhaps were not as useful as the previous week, whilst the Nuwara Eliya's were not up to expectations. A select range of improved seasonal Uva's were on offer.

In the Western High Grown category, Best Western BOP's were easier by Rs. 50 per kg and more for last week's high-priced teas. Corresponding BOPF's, whilst a few select invoices sold around last levels, others often declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more following quality. In the Below Best category, BOP's - High-priced teas of last week were firm and easier, whilst the others were irregular. Corresponding BOPF's, where quality was maintained, prices were firm, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. At the lower end, BOP's declined by Rs. 20 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's were Rs. 20-30 per kg lower. Nuwara Eliyas' were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uda Pussellawas' were irregular and easier. Uva - Seasonal BOP's sold between Rs. 2,000-3,100 per kg, whilst the corresponding BOPF's sold between Rs. 2,000-2,250 per kg. Others non-seasonal BOP's were barely steady, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg.

High & Medium Grown CTC teas continued to sell around last subject to price fluctuations following quality. Corresponding Low Grown BP1's - A few select invoices were dearer, whilst the others sold around last. PF1's - Better teas were firm and marginally dearer, whilst the secondary types were marginally easier.

Low Growns totalled approximately 2.4 M/Kgs. All categories met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, well-made BOP1's were firm, whilst the Below Best together with the bolder varieties were irregular. Teas at the bottom maintained. Select Best and Best OP1's sold around last levels, whilst the balance were irregular. Well-made OP/OPA's appreciated, whilst the balance sold around last levels. Select Best PEK's maintained, whilst the Best together with the mixed/open varieties declined. High-priced PEK1's were easier, whilst the balance were fully firm.

In the Tippy catalogue, Select Best FBOP's sold around last levels, whilst the balance were firm to dearer. However, the bolder varieties declined. Select Best and Best FF1's together with the cleaner Below Best varieties were firm to dearer, whilst the balance were irregular following quality.

In the Premium catalogue, very Tippy teas were firm on last, whilst the Best and Below Best appreciated. Balance were firm.

The Nuwara Eliya Region reported an increase in the crop intake, whilst the Western, Uva, Uda Pussellawa and Low Grown regions reported a decrease.



HIGH GROWN TEAS



BOP Best Western's were irregular and easier by up to Rs. 50 per kg and more for last week's select high-priced teas. In the

Below Best category, select high-priced teas were firm and easier, whilst the others were irregular following quality. Teas at the lower end were firm and Rs. 20 per kg easier. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were irregularly easier and mostly unsold. Best Uva's (seasonal) sold well between Rs. 2,000-3,000 per kg, whilst the others

were barely steady.

BOPF Best Western's - A few select invoices sold around last week's levels, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg

and more following quality. In the Below Best category, where quality was maintained, prices were firm, whilst the others declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Teas at the lower end were firm and Rs. 20-30 per kg easier following quality. Nuwara Eliya's were mostly unsold. Uda Pussellawa's were irregular and easier. Uva's - Seasonal teas sold well

between Rs. 2,000-2,250 per kg, whilst the others declined by up to Rs. 50 per kg.

OP/OPA Well-made varieties were firm on last levels, whilst the others and poorer sorts were firm to easier by Rs. 20-40 per

kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1 Flavoury PEK's were easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the Orthodox Leafy PEK's were firm. Best PEK1's were dearer by

Rs. 50-100 per kg and more at times. Teas at the lower end were firm to easier by Rs. 20-40 per kg. Best Rotovane PEK's remained mostly firm to irregularly easier by Rs. 40-60 per kg, whilst the others and poorer sorts declined

following quality.

FBOP/FBOPF1 Select Best flavoury FBOP/FBOPF1's were firm to dearer by Rs. 20-40 per kg, whilst the poorer sorts were firm. Better Orthodox FBOP/FBOPF1's appreciated by Rs. 30-50 per kg, whilst the others and teas at the lower end held firm.


